'Round the State

State Police Investigating Attack on Driver, Family

KLAMATH FALLS (AP)—Alfred Minasco of Bly, Ore., Monday reported what state police here termed "a strange highway occurrence."

Minasco, his wife and their three children were driving in their pickup truck along highway 39 just outside of Bly Monday when, he said, another pickup pulled alongside and forced them into a ditch.

Minasco said he got out to talk to the other driver, and was told the men in the other vehicle were "going to get him." Minasco said he jumped back into his truck and drove down the highway with the other pickup in pursuit.

He said the men in the truck opened fire with rifles, and punctured one of Minasco's tires. Minasco and his family deserted the truck and fled into the hills, with bullets whining over their heads.

He said he didn't remember how many men there were.

When they returned to the truck after the other vehicle had left, they found it full of bullet holes and the gas tank filled with dirt.

State police said they had no suspects for the shooting.

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Neuberger Gets \$7,000 From Demo Organization

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Democratic Senate Campaign Committee is helping foot campaign bills for party candidates rated by the committee as having good chances of winning Republican seats.

Leslie L. Biffle, secretary-treasurer of the campaign organization, gave out some of the figures Tuesday, showing contributions as high as \$7,000.

The committee also is mailing checks to Democratic incumbent senators who have tough opposition. In those cases the checks run as high as \$10,000.

Committee strategists profess to be very confident that the Democrats can overturn enough Republicans to take control of the Senate starting next January.

The present lineup is 49 Republicans, 46 Democrats and one Independent. The Independent Sen. Morse (Ore.) has said he will vote with the Democrats on organization of the Senate in the 84th Congress.

Among the Democratic candidates getting help is Glen H. Taylor, former Idaho senator who bolted his party in 1948 to run with Henry A. Wallace on the

Progressive Party ticket as the vice-presidential candidate. Taylor now is trying to unseat Sen. Dworshak and Biffle labeled his prospects "very promising." On that basis he said Taylor was sent a check for \$3,000.

Other contributions sent to Democratic nominees considered by the committee to have a good chance to unseat Republicans include: Oregon—\$7,000 to State Sen. Richard L. Neuberger, running against Sen. Cordon.
