Greeks' Demands for Cyprus Strain Turkish, Yugoslav Ties

ISTANBUL (AP)—Greek demands for Cyprus are straining the new ties linking Greece with Turkey and Yugoslavia in a 20-year military pact.

Turkish officials, vitally interested in Britain's strategic crown colony in the eastern Mediterranean, hint that continued Greek pressure before the United Nations will poison Greek-Turkish friendship and make military co-operation impossible.

TURKEY COMMITTED

Turkish public opinion strongly opposes the Greek demand. Cyprus is in headlines day after day. Newspapers urge the Ankara government to join actively in the fight. Turkey's public policy thus far has been one of restraint.

A change in this policy may have been heralded by the Ankara newspaper Zafer, which often re-

flects the views of Prime Minister Adnan Menderes. It said Greek success in getting the Cyprus question on the United Nations agenda "make it imperative for Turkey to take an active part in the quarrel . . . Turkey cannot possibly accept any decision changing the island's status . . . Greece must be brought to its senses."

BACKGROUND

Cyprus was under Turkish rule for more than 300 years until the Ottoman Empire, in 1878, ceded the island to Britain in return for a British pledge to help fight any Russian aggression against Asia Minor. Cyprus is 500 miles from the Greek mainland but only 40 miles off Turkey's southern coast. About four fifths of the island's 500,000 people are of Greek descent, the remainder of Turkish extraction.

The British, building up the 125-mile long island as a military base to replace Suez, say they will not consider moving out and will boycott any U.N. debate on the subject.

Hunters Nab Two Escapees

WALLA WALLA, Wash. (AP)—Three bird hunters, including a Superior Court judge, Tuesday captured two state prison inmates who scaled the wall Monday night after forcing a guard into a cell at knifepoint.

The two fugitives, weary and cold, after a night "on the go," were captured in an open field about 10 miles southeast of Walla Walla, near the Blue Mountains foothills.

The escapees, who were back in prison before noon, were Irvin Squires, 26, under sentence as a Seattle "boy killer," and Nolton E. Jacobs, 40, under sentence from Lewis County for robbery. Squires was serving a life term for the killing of a Seattle school girl. He and Jacobs escaped from the prison, after taking a key from the overpowered guard, by using a makeshift ladder and a hook made from a pipe.

The party of hunters that "flushed" the pair on a pheasant hunt were Judge Albert N. Bradford, Dr. Dick Shaver and M. H. Miner.

The hunters, who knew of the prison escape, spotted the two men dressed in blue shirts and blue jeans in a brushy area. Miner flushed them out while the other two circled back to a farmhouse and called the sheriff's office.

The fugitives offered no resistance.

Egyptians Indict 13 Spy Suspects

CAIRO, Egypt (AP)—Egypt's military government Tuesday accused 12 men and a woman of spying for Israel.

The roundup of the alleged spy and sabotage ring came during an investigation of attempts to burn down the U. S. Information Service libraries in Cairo and Alexandria last July.

The indictments were released Tuesday. They said the ringleader was an Israeli army officer.

SALEM (AP)—Saturday will be National Olympic Day and Gov. Paul L. Patterson called on Oregonians Wednesday to join in its observance.

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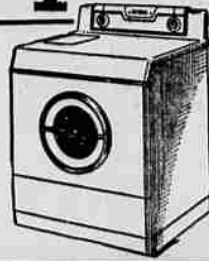
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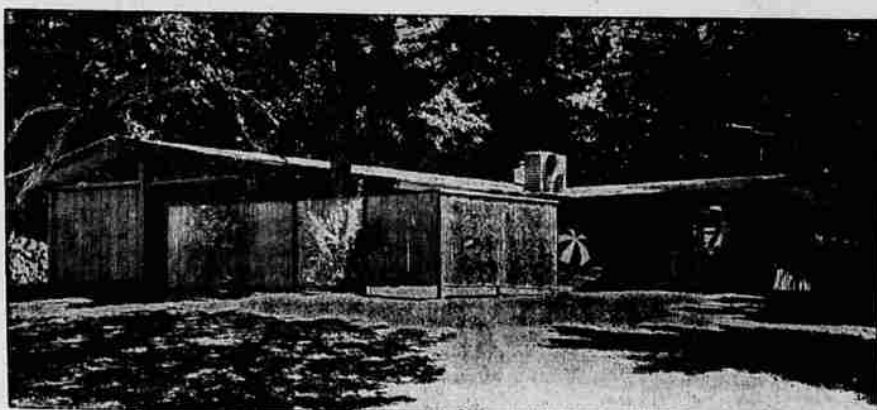
