

Egypt Cheers End of British Occupation

Government Signs
Long-Sought Treaty

CAIRO, Egypt (AP)—Organized crowds cheering Prime Minister Gamal Abdel Nasser gathered at Egypt's Parliament Building Wednesday to celebrate the signing of the treaty ending British occupation of the Suez Canal zone.

Nasser, the young soldier who led the bloodless coup that de-throned ex-King Farouk two years ago, signed the long-sought evacuation treaty Tuesday night. Anthony Nutting, 34-year-old British minister of state, headed the British delegation.

Government-sponsored youth rally groups and delegations of trade unions paraded to the Parliament Building and Nasser's office, while overhead roared jet fighters, bombers and training planes of the Egyptian air force.

Despite the military government's proclamation of a nationwide holiday there was a curious lack of spontaneous jubilation in the first hours of the celebration. The government radio announced police would escort demonstrators to prevent "subversive elements" from stirring up trouble.

The signing ceremony was held in the green-pillared Pharaonic Hall of Parliament. Under terms of the treaty, the 83,000 British troops garrisoning the canal zone will be evacuated within 20 months but British civilian technicians will maintain a few selected installations for seven years after the troops withdraw.

Britain also has the right to return to the bases within the seven-year period if an outside power—meaning Russia—attacks Turkey or an Arab state.

Puerto Rican Red Leaders Arrested

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Justice Department announced Wednesday that FBI agents in New York City and Puerto Rico have arrested 10 leaders of the Puerto Rican Communist Party on charges of seeking the violent overthrow of the government.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said the arrests would cripple the Communist apparatus in Puerto Rico. He said the group, which is not directly connected with the American Communist Party, has agitated, along with the Puerto Rican Nationalist group, for independence of the island commonwealth.

The FBI said only one of the arrests—that of Eugenio Cuebas Arbona—was made in New York. The other nine were picked up in Puerto Rico. Cuebas Arbona was identified by the FBI as having been associated with the Communist Party in Puerto Rico since 1941.

The arrests brought to 128 the number of Communist leaders seized since July, 1948, on charges of conspiring to teach and advo-

cate the overthrow of the government. The FBI has conducted 15 roundups of Communist leaders. FBI agents filed complaints against the 10 Puerto Ricans seized in the latest sweep. Hoover said they would be taken as soon as possible before the nearest U.S. commissioners.

Among those arrested were Juan Santos-Rivera, described by the FBI as a Moscow-trained Communist, and Juan Emmanuel, who was named as liaison man between Communist parties of the United States and Puerto Rico. The FBI indicated both men were seized in Puerto Rico.

Scelba Voted Confidence

Brawling Deputies
Break Up Session

ROME (AP)—A brawling chamber of deputies gave Premier Mario Scelba a 285-265 vote of confidence Wednesday on Italy's agreement with Yugoslavia for the division of the Trieste territory.

Fights between Communists and Scelba's coalition government supporters broke up the session twice and it was nearly dawn before the vote was taken. Six deputies and five ushers were injured in the fighting.

The fistfuffs started when Christian Democrat Deputy Giuseppe Togni accused the Communists of "serving another nation other than Italy," and of having among their number "a lot of former Fascist spies." The Communist members charged from their benches and grappled with ushers in an effort to reach Togni.

With Scelba reportedly insisting on completion of the debate and the vote of confidence "if it takes all night," the chamber was reconvened after a 5½-hour delay. The session remained noisy but the ballot finally was taken.

The vote of confidence approved the agreement reached on the bitterly disputed area between Italy and Yugoslavia at the head of the Adriatic Sea. The agreement, initiated Oct. 5, gives Italy the British-American occupied Zone A, including the port city of Trieste.

Zone B goes to Yugoslavia. It has been under Yugoslav occupation since the 1947 Italian peace treaty which created a free territory.

Oregon, Washington Broadcasters Meet

SPOKANE (AP)—Broadcasters from Oregon and Washington held separate state meetings Tuesday at the opening of the second and final day of the district 17 meeting of the National Assn. of Radio and Television Broadcasters.

The Oregon association discussed plans for its regular fall meeting to be held Nov. 19 at Salem. Robert Summers, secretary of the Oregon group, said details would be released later.

Queen Knights Anthony Eden In Order of the Garter

LONDON (AP)—Queen Elizabeth II Wednesday knighted Anthony Eden in the Order of the Garter. His elevation to England's order of chivalry came at a time of triumph for the 57-year-old foreign secretary, regarded by most as the ultimate successor to Prime Minister Churchill.

In a 15-minute private ceremony at Buckingham Palace, Eden knelt before his young queen, felt a light tap of a sword upon both shoulders, and heard her say "Arise, Sir Anthony."

Announcement of the knighting came as a surprise. It occurred just before his departure for Paris and the continuing negotiations for putting West German soldiers into the Western defense setup.

Eden has been credited with a leading role in the revival of such efforts after the French torpedoed the European Defense Community treaty.

The honor bestowed upon Eden was a signal sign of his

sovereign's personal approval. He joined Churchill, among others, as a member of the Order of the Garter in the ceremony which dates back to the days when knights were in armor and went forth to do battle with banners flying.

Eden is only the seventh commoner to receive the honor since 1700.

Unattractive Dresses To Adorn Mayor

OTTAWA (AP)—Mayor Charlotte Whitton is going to wear unattractive dresses to meetings of the city Board of Control from now on.

Arriving 25 minutes late to deliver a speech to a service club Tuesday, she explained: "Every time they (the Board of Control) see me wearing a pretty dress, they know I have an engagement and they do their best to delay me."

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
