

Oil Agreement Gets Approval

TEHRAN, Iran (AP)—Iran's lower house of Parliament Thursday overwhelmingly ratified an agreement that will permit eight foreign companies to put the nation's oil on the world market again.

Deputies in the Majlis (House) voted 113 to five, with two abstaining, in favor of the accord which ends a dispute that began in 1951 when Mohammed Mossadegh, then premier, nationalized the vast Anglo-Iranian Oil Co.

The agreement will become law after the Senate ratifies it and it is signed by the Shah of Iran.

The long dispute over Iranian oil approached the settlement stage last Aug. 5 when the government and the eight oil companies initiated the agreement which will give the country a minimum of 420 million dollars in revenue during the next three years.
