NEW YORK (AP)—The third-place New York Rangers may have to call for oxygen because they are over the 500 mark for the first time since 1950 and their 3-2 record has put them in high and unfamiliar surroundings in the National Hockey League standings.

New York made an impressive home debut Wednesday night by whipping the Boston Bruins, 6-2. The two teams started the night's only NHL contest deadlocked for third place.

★ George Shaw has figured out a way for Oregon to be in the Rose Bowl, despite two conference defeats. The formula includes Oregon winning all remaining games, UCLA defeating every opponent other than Oregon and Cal upsetting USC this week. ... We asked George and a few of his teammates if they would be willing to give up their Christmas jobs right now—on the prospects. ...

One of the extra members of the ticket department caring for student football tickets is Jim Lescutoff, big Oregon varsity center who was one of the best Northern Division rebounders a couple of years ago. ...

Because of special dyes, Washington's football uniforms will feature more brilliance—purple jersey and gold pants. ... Shoeless Joe Ulm, San Jose fullback, averaged 6.5 yards on two plays before being hurt and benched for the season, but a substitute, Darrel Clement averaged 9 yards on seven plays. ...

Charley Gillilan, who saw the USC-TCU game in Los Angeles several weeks ago, rates Ron Clinkcale, who scored twice against the Trojans, as a faster football back than Jon Arnett. He is a 9.6 sprinter, which helps.

★ Paul Larson of Cal completed 17 of 31 passes for 235 yards with no interceptions and two touchdowns against WSC last week to become the nation's leader in passing. His teammate, End Jim Hanifan, caught 7 for 78 yards to become the nation's pass-receiving leader. ...

Les Baldinger, former Uni High fullback and now San Jose businessman who is visiting here this week, said that the Spartans have a good football team despite the 45-0 loss to California (13 fumbles), but San Jose State would have been considerably stronger with "Shoeless Joe" Ulm playing fullback. The hard-luck back is out with a shoulder separation and hopes to play next season. The Spartans will ask the PCC to grant him an extra year of eligibility.

George Shaw was awarded Sportsvision's "Player of the Week" for Oregon in the California game. The honor is selected each week on the Pacific Coast League's television highlights. A similar award is made to the Big-Ten "Player of the Week."

You Be The Quarterback

Wisconsin, a slight underdog, has Michigan State down, 13-7, in the fourth quarter, but the Spartans have driven to the Wisconsin one-yard line, where it is fourth down and goal in what may be State's last big chance for victory.

The Spartans have used a multiple offense. This has included double wingback plays with two backs just outside their ends, the fullback behind center deep and the quarterback used as a blocker; single wingback formations with all four backs lined up in the same direction; T-formation plays with the line close together; and split-T plays with the line spaced and the quarterback running parallel to the line.

As Michigan State quarterback rate these plays 1, 2, 3 and 4 for this situation: Drive over left tackle by left wingback from double wing. Slant at left tackle by tailback from single wing. Slant at left tackle by fullback from split-T. Drive over left tackle by left halfback from straight T.

Portland Given Slap by NCAA

NEW ORLEANS (AP)—City College of New York and Miami (Fla.) University were placed on probation for a year and two other schools were reprimanded by the executive council of the National Collegiate Athletic Association Thursday for rule violations.

City College, involved in the 1950 basketball scandals, was prohibited from participating in the 1955 NCAA basketball tournament only, while Miami was ruled ineligible to enter athletes or teams in NCAA championship events for the college year, 1954-55.

The two schools reprimanded were Western Illinois State College of Macomb, Ill., and the University of Portland, Portland, Ore. Western Illinois was disciplined for playing in the Corn Bowl football game in Bloomington, Ill., Nov. 26, 1953, a game not certified by the NCAA extra events committee, and Portland for trying out 11 prospective basketball players during the weekend of April 10-11, 1954, on its campus.

San Jose Offense Clicks in Practice

San Jose State's offense, clicking for the first time offensively and defensively in the 19-12 victory over a good Arizona State team two weeks ago, clicked again on the varsity practice field Wednesday afternoon—"Bloody Wednesday." The Oregon Webfoots, who meet the San Jose Spartans here Saturday, escaped without injury and Trainer Bob Officer sighed his usual breath of relief.

The Webfoots are not in the best of physical condition even so. Center Ron Pfeister and Guard Jim Potter haven't worked all week, and Quarterback Wally Russell drilled for the first time Wednesday—and not in scrimmage. X-rays showed that Fred Jacobs, reserve end, has no spinal injury, but he was missing from practice. Most important casualty has been to Jack Roche, Len Casanova's chief assistant, who has been confined for the second time this season with a heavy cold.

Halfback Tom Crabtree, a slow starter, looked like the best runner in a 20-minute offensive scrimmage that followed a half-hour of defensive head-butting. Fullback Larry Rose, who ran well Tuesday, fumbled on three plays.

Coach Bob Bronson's Spartans have had the advantage of a full week of rest since the game at Tempe and the layoff has strengthened the Spartans materially. Oregon will be faced with two ace break-away running threats in Stan Beasley and Roy Hiram, with 8.6 and 8-yard averages and a power runner in Fullback Dave Fanner who has gained 80 yards without a loss, and the passing of Ben Pierce, with 33 out of 59 for 444 yards.

Oregon's tackling was much to be desired in the scrimmage against San Jose plays, but the ball-handling with a wet ball was encouraging—with the exception of Rose.

Dick Mohley, veteran end, will be co-captain with Pfeister for the San Jose game. A crowd of
