Surgeons' Society Schedule Meeting

The Eugene Surgical Society, organized last spring, will hold its annual meeting Friday. A widely known surgeon will be the principal speaker.

He is Dr. Joel W. Baker, chief of surgery at Virginia Mason Clinic in Seattle. He will speak during the afternoon session in the auditorium at Sacred Heart Hospital and again during the evening at a banquet in the Eugene Hotel.

NUCLEUS OF 17

The society was formed with a nucleus of 17 local surgeons who had been meeting informally for several years to review journal items of interest in their field.

The new organization has as its goal to "establish and maintain an association of surgeons to advance the science of surgery, the surgical standards in Eugene, and the ethical and competent practicing of its art."

The group holds meetings once a month. The program is devoted to some surgical problem, and presentation is by one or more members of the society. The annual clinical meetings, featured distinguished speakers, are to be held each fall.

SOCIETY'S OFFICERS

This Friday's program will begin at 1 p.m. Members of the society will present papers. Dr. Baker's talk will end the session.

All interested persons are invited to attend the evening banquet.

Officers of the society are Dr. D. B. Judd, president; Dr. J. A. Bradley, vice president, and Dr. S. J. Hoffman, secretary-treasurer. In charge of the annual meeting is Dr. L. D. Jacobson, aided by Drs. George Hemphill and Bradley.

EVS Planning New Classes

Classes in home planning and blueprint reading will start at Eugene Vocational School the week of Oct. 25.

The home planning class is designed for women and men interested in making home alterations. The instructor, Art Clough, will teach topics regarding materials, designs, home traffic, interior decoration, and other household problems.

The blueprint reading class will only be for persons in the building trades who are interested in increasing their earning ability by specialized instruction in the reading of blueprints and estimating building construction costs from prints and specifications. Clough will also teach this class.

Scheduling will depend on a sufficient number of persons enrolling. Further information is available at the school.

HOLLYWOOD — Jesse Hibbs, the old USC football star now turned movie director, has discovered that the best way to film a war is to surrender.

Hibbs is directing war hero Audie Murphy in his own life story "To Hell and Back." War scenes, re-enacting virtually every major battle Audie was in, are being shot at the Yakima, Wash., Firing Center.

"Starting the battles was a cinch," Hibbs admits. "I just fired the first shot and the gun went into action."

But stopping the action was another matter. Loudspeakers could not be heard over the din of the battle. No one could hear Hibbs' cries of "cut," so in desperation he hit on a solution.

From his observation post behind the cameras, he merely ran up the white flag of surrender. It worked.

Robbery Suspect Pleads Innocent

SPOKANE — George Quatsling, 21-year-old native of Czechoslovakia, Tuesday pleaded innocent in federal district court to the charge of committing the \$138,000 holdup of the Dishman State Bank Sept. 10.
