Lions Hear Mexican Diplomat

Speaker Is for Red China in U.N.

A former interpreter for the United Nations said Wednesday Red China should be admitted as a member of that world organization.
Roberto Sein, Mexican diplomat and a long-time representative of various UN agencies, told

members of the Eugene Kiwanis Club Red China should be admitted so she could be made to accept the obligations imposed by the UN charter.
Admission of Red China, Sein asserted, would permit representatives of that nation and the United States and other powers to confer on vital problems and exchange ideas.
Sein asserted it would be best to have Red China in a position where attempts could be made to eliminate points of friction rather than have her on the outside, which means no UN representation for practically the whole of Asia.
Sein, who gave his views on Red China during a question and answer period, spoke to Kiwanis in connection with observ-

ance of United Nations Week.
There is danger, Sein said, that groups throughout the world may become only spectators in the present age of change.

"The world is now in revolution. It is in revolution against hunger, in revolution against dictatorship and colonialism, and in revolution against darkness and ignorance," he said.
He said the United Nations is not anti-U.S. or anti-Soviet or anti-anyone. "It is a world court of opinion. It is everyone's organization."
A basic concept of the UN charter, Sein said, is for the nations of the world to practice

tolerance and live together in peace as good neighbors.
"I believe in the United Nations," Sein said, "because it not only provides a way to solve international political problems, but also provides the opportunity to improve standards of living and eliminate disease and ignorance throughout the world."
Sein pointed to numerous examples of how the UN has halted armed conflict between nations by interceding. "It is better to negotiate for 10 years rather than fight 10 minutes," he declared.
"The United Nations is yours. How weak? As weak as you keep it. How strong? As strong as you make it," Sein said.
"The United Nations is yours, common man of the common millions," Sein concluded.

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—The reconditioned and modernized USS Oriskany, now one of America's most potent jet-age aircraft carriers, will sail Friday to join the active fleet. The Navy announcement did not say where the carrier is going.

U. N. a Bargain Rotary Told

The United Nations was described Wednesday as a "bargain" which costs each of us less than 10 cents a year" by Rev. Harold S. Shellhart, in an address to the Springfield Rotary Club.
The Reverend Shellhart heads a committee appointed by Springfield's Mayor Edward C. Harms Jr. to call attention to the current observance of United Nations Week.
He expressed regret that next Sunday's observance of the ninth birthday of the United Nations

will probably mean little to many citizens of the United States. But, he added, the day will be full of meaning to "millions of people around the world."
The speaker showed the Rotarians a film strip which depicted some of the activities which United Nations agencies are carrying on throughout the world.
These activities, he said, are what make the United Nations the bargain that it is. He also quoted from an article written

by Henry Cabot Lodge Jr., head of this nation's U.N. delegation, declaring that "without the United Nations, the world would probably already be involved in World War III."
The Rotarians devoted a good portion of their meeting to making final plans for the big Parade of Barbershop Quartets program scheduled for Saturday night in Springfield.
The club also bestowed an honorary membership upon the Reverend A. O. Odegaard, of Springfield.

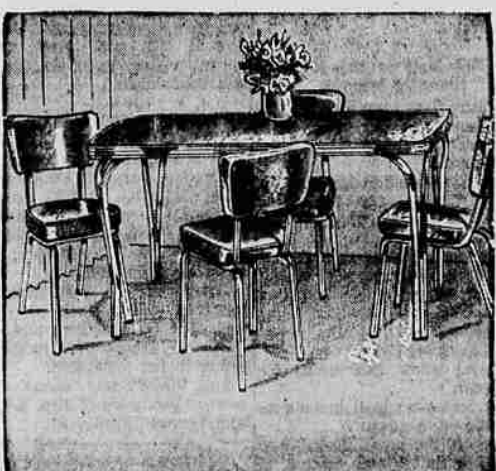

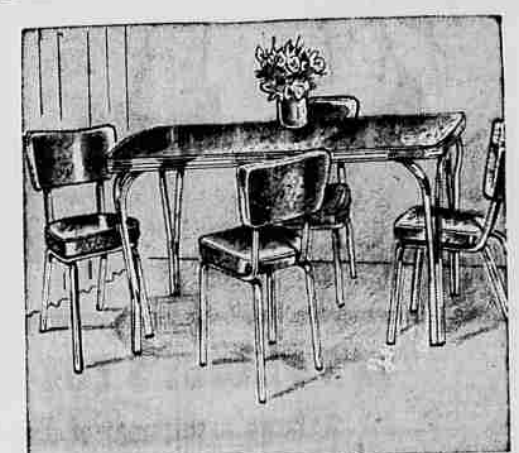

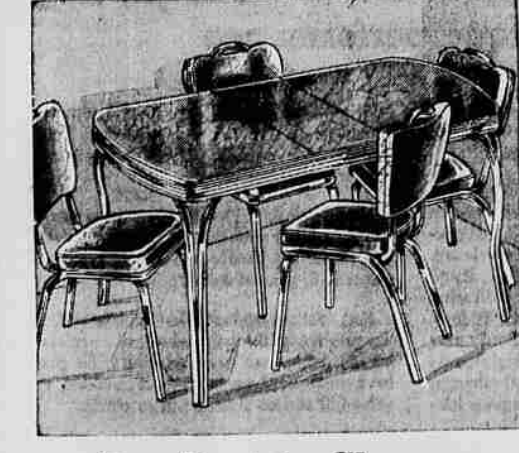
