Reds Won't Recognize U.S. Consulate in Saigon

SAIGON, Viet Nam (AP)—The Vietminh committee administering Hanoi announced Thursday it does not recognize the U. S. consulate in the Communist-occupied North Indochina city.

A seven-member American team, headed by Consul Thomas G. Corcoran, stayed in Hanoi after the French evacuated the city earlier this month. British and French missions also are hanging on.

A communique, issued by the committee, blasted recent State Department statements that the U. S. consulate would remain because the Geneva armistice agreement drew a military, not political, dividing line across Viet Nam. This assertion "constitutes a violation against the sovereignty of the Democratic republic of Viet Nam (Vietminh)," the committee declared.

It added that the American declaration was "totally contrary to the Geneva conventions, which say clearly the region north of the military demarcation line is provisionally placed under the direction of the government of the Democratic republic of Viet Nam."

The committee said it thus considered the declaration "unacceptable and declares it does not recognize the consulate of the United States at Hanoi."

The American embassy in Saigon said the Vietminh move came as no surprise but had not been expected so soon.

"Whether the consulate remains now depends entirely on whether they (the Vietminh) wish it to and also on how long the United States considers it to her advantage to keep it there," an embassy officer said.

Sen. Herman Welker, the Idaho Republican who is with the Citizens for Eisenhower squad in Eugene Wednesday night and early Thursday—but he scheduled no speech here. Welker, who was originally billed to speak to a Republican women's group, cancelled that because of a sore throat.

11 Senators Stump State

Marilyn Back At Film Studio After Hearing

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—It was back to the movie cameras Thursday for Marilyn Monroe, who divorced Joe DiMaggio in a 15-minute hearing Wednesday.

No comment was heard from the former New York Yankees baseball star on the end of their well publicized, nine-month marriage.

Sobbing, the shapely blonde star, clad in a black flannel suit, told Judge Orlando H. Rhodes in Santa Monica Superior Court:

"I had hoped to have out of marriage love, warmth, affection and understanding. But instead he gave me coolness and indifference."

"My husband would get into moods and wouldn't talk to me for long periods—five to seven days sometimes, maybe longer—10 days. And if I tried to approach him, he usually said: 'Leave me alone.'"

"When I asked him, 'What's the matter?' he replied, 'Stop nagging me.'"

"I offered to give up my work in hopes that would solve our problems. But that didn't change his attitude at all."

Mysterious Explosion Kills Three Philadelphia Firemen

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Three ranking fire department officers were killed and 24 other firemen and policemen injured Thursday in an odd explosion confined entirely to the rear yard of a north Philadelphia chemical manufacturing plant.

The violent blast, without any fire, occurred minutes after a telephoned warning summoned the fire company to investigate the source of escaping fumes, thought to be ammonia.

TANK SHATTERED
A 15-foot-high steel tank mounted on a wooden platform in one corner of the yard exploded without warning as firemen searched for the source of the fumes.

So powerful was the explosion that it slammed the firemen, and several policemen who stood nearby with terrific force against two 25-foot-high brick walls enclosing the yard.

Rescuers found the dead and injured lying grotesquely on the ground. The steel tank was torn in pieces. Several windows in nearby buildings were shattered.

Killed were Deputy Fire Chief Thomas Kline, and Battalion Chiefs John J. News and John P. Magrann.

The firemen, led by News, were called to the two-story Charles W. Berg laboratories plant building at 5.55 a.m. Outwardly, there appeared to be no sign of trouble. The blast came 10 minutes later.

Deputy Fire Commissioner George E. Hink said the cause of the fumes and the blast are a mystery.

"We searched the plant and we don't know where the fumes came from," Hink said. "There was no damage inside the place. We also have no explanation for what caused the tank to explode. There will be a thorough investigation."
