West Siders Report Progress On Ambitious Building Plans

West side churches are in the news again this week, not to announce specially the next week's activities, but to give a short review of unfolding and progress in 1954. The various congregations and the residents of the areas served by the churches can expect another year of sincere endeavor to bring the church and Bible teachings to every home. The west side churches, with one exception, are more stabilized and busily engaged in building programs to fulfill the needs of the growing congregations.

The newest church group, Trinity Evangelical Lutheran, formerly Westmoreland Lutheran, is now fully organized as a mission church. Since they are meeting in temporary quarters at the Westmoreland School, a committee is seeking a building site for their own parish house.

Also partially completed is the new edifice of Pilgrim Holiness Church on South Friendly St. The congregation will occupy the basement rooms at an early date while the auditorium is being finished. The old church will be torn down to make room for landscaping and will also remove the obstructed view of the street intersection.

Friends Church expects to complete the clearing of their property on rural West Eighteenth Avenue this New Year week-end and the staking out for the foundation of the first unit of the new church will follow within a short time. Only the trees that would interfere with the building have been taken out and the many old oaks and evergreens will remain on the property to add to its natural beauty.

Bethel Mission church on West Eleventh Avenue has completed the exterior of their new building started about two years ago. The partitions are not completed in the Sunday School rooms nor for the commissionary rooms. There is some work to be done yet in the main auditorium. The church members and workers have had an extremely active schedule with supplying clothes and food to needy families. The Rev. D. F. Ridenour and his wife extend sincere thanks to all those who have contributed materials for distribution and more clothing and food is always acceptable.

West Side Church of Christ is also completing the interior of their new educational unit that has been in progress for several years. William J. Richardson,

pastor, in commenting on the building program, mentioned the fact that it would soon be necessary to again add more room. The church already owns adjacent property which is now being used for parking.

Bailey Hill Evangelical United Brethren Church did not fare so well in 1954. The congregation is not large enough to support a full-time pastor and there is too much work to be done for the pastor to serve the Bailey Hill church and the Willakenzie EUB church as in 1953, so the Bailey Hill group was discontinued until other arrangements could be made. In the meantime, the congregation attends the services at First EUB church in Eugene.

Another colored congregation that has progressed this last year has been St. Mark's Methodist. The Rev. and Mrs. Herman C. Riley reside next door to the church. A parking lot has been provided for the church goers and much maintenance work has been done on the church building.

West side's most typical rural church, Spencer Creek Lutheran, located 10 miles southwest of Eugene, is still at work on a solution for enlarged church facilities and a parsonage close to the church. A fine choir has been organized and a good Ladies Aid is functioning. The Rev. Gottlieb Schmitt, pastor, will render his farewell sermon Sunday and has accepted the pastorage of Freeborn Lutheran Church at East Stanwood, Washington.
