'ROUND THE STATE

Holman Reported in Line For Federal Judgeship

PORTLAND —The Oregon Journal's Washington correspondent reported Friday that President Eisenhower will send to the new Congress the nomination of Circuit Judge Ralph Holman of Oregon City to fill a vacant Oregon federal judgeship.

According to the report Holman, 40, was recommended by Sen. Guy Cordon and state Republican leaders. It also said Independent Sen. Wayne Morse and Democratic Sen.-elect Richard L. Neuberger had let it be known to the Justice Department that they have no objection to Holman's appointment.

The department was said to be completing its investigation of Holman and preparing to ask the President to send his name to the Senate.

Holman said at Oregon City Friday that the appointment had not been discussed with him but that he was a "hopeful aspirant" for the judgeship.

The judgeship has been vacant since earlier in the year when Judge James A. Fee was elevated to the U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco.

Favors Merger

PORTLAND —City-county consolidation in Multnomah county was favored Friday by Mayor Fred L. Peterson in his annual report to the city council.

The mayor said that because voters have indicated they did not wish to boost allowable revenues to either government body "it would seem to me that... it is advisable to consolidate the city of Portland and the county of Multnomah operations."

He said the advantages to the taxpayers were multiple "with little likelihood of any disadvantages to the people of Portland or the residents of Multnomah county outside Portland."

Court Established

CORVALLIS —A District Court replaced the old Justice of the Peace courts in Benton County effective Saturday.

Members of the Benton County Bar Assn. were on hand Friday for the swearing in of Richard Mengler as the first district judge. Attending the ceremony was Arthur L. Peck who completed a six-year term as justice of the peace for the county.

Judge Appointed

SALEM —Edward O. Stadler Jr., who was Marion County district attorney from 1949 to 1952, was appointed by Gov. Patterson Friday as district judge for Marion County.

Stadler succeeds Val Sloper, who was elected circuit judge at the November election. Stadler's father now is completing his second term as Deschutes County district attorney.

The new judge did not seek reelection as district attorney.

Road Outlay High

PORTLAND —Federal aid for Pacific Northwest road construction will go up to a record \$49,100,964 next year, the federal Bureau of Public Roads reports.

F. E. Andrews, division engineer for the bureau, said the total might be even higher if the President's proposal for more expenditures on interstate highways is approved.

All ready allocated for 1955 are \$14,061,986 for Washington, \$13,531,734 for Montana, \$12,889,469 for Oregon and \$8,697,775 for Idaho. The states will contribute matching funds.

Seeks Fare Boost

PORTLAND —City Commissioner Nate Eddy said Thursday he will recommend a fare increase for Portland Traction Co. Eddy said he will propose a fare of 20 cents or three rides for a half-dollar.

The present fare is 15 cents. The company asked for the increase because of higher operating costs and lack of patronage.

Plane Debris Yields Gems

Diamonds Aboard British Airliner

PRESTWICK, Scotland —Three diamonds were found Friday near the wreckage of the Atlantic airliner which crashed Christmas Day, killing 28.

The find strengthened the belief the British Overseas Airways Corp. plane carried a large consignment of diamonds worth possibly a million pounds (\$2,800,000).

Police officers, insurance representatives and BOAC officials searched the crash area at Prestwick airport for further trace of precious stones. Other officials, including post office men, checked mail records trying to determine for certain whether a huge diamond consignment to New York was aboard when the plane crashed before dawn last Saturday.

In New York, Louis Baumgold, a diamond dealer, said the plane carried a regular monthly shipment of diamonds for American dealers. He would not estimate their value. They were rough gems being shipped to the United States for cutting and sale, he said.

A London diamond expert found the three stones. "This means," he said, "that a minute search of the area will have to be made since some of the stones could have been trodden into the earth during rescue work."

A half dozen plainclothesmen prowled through the debris Thursday. The wreckage is now being taken apart by investigators and the bits hauled to a hanger for further study.

Demo Favors Tax Meeting

ASTORIA —State Sen. R. D. Holmes, Gearhart Democrat, written Sen. Carl Francis, Dayton Republican, offering to participate in a non-partisan meeting proposed by Sen. Francis to consider Oregon's financial and tax problems.

Holmes said he had been informed that Francis recently issued a statement opposing a sales tax as a solution to financial problems, and calling for a non-partisan meeting of persons who share this opinion.

"As you know, I have always opposed this regressive form of taxation," Holmes wrote. "Recently Howard Morgan, Democratic state chairman, appointed me chairman of a committee of Democrats to seek other tax solutions than a sales tax during the coming legislative session."

Woman Democrat Setting Up Housekeeping in Washington

WASHINGTON —Mrs. Edith Green—the only woman and the only Democrat in the Oregon House delegation—was deep in the problem of setting up housekeeping in the nation's capital Friday.

She also was concerned with the equally feminine worry about men—her husband, Arthur, and 12-year-old son Dick parted company with her in Chicago to go to Detroit for a new car and haven't arrived here yet.

The new congresswoman, who will be sworn in next Wednesday, said she considers foreign policy

to be one of the major problems confronting the Congress.

Asked if she could be expected to follow the administration's foreign policy program, she replied: "I would certainly follow President Eisenhower instead of Sen. Knowland (R-Calif.) with his proposal for blockade of China."

A firm believer in the United Nations, she said she felt this international organization should be "strengthened" through use.
