The Luther League will serve refreshments following the business session, which will be held in the church proper.

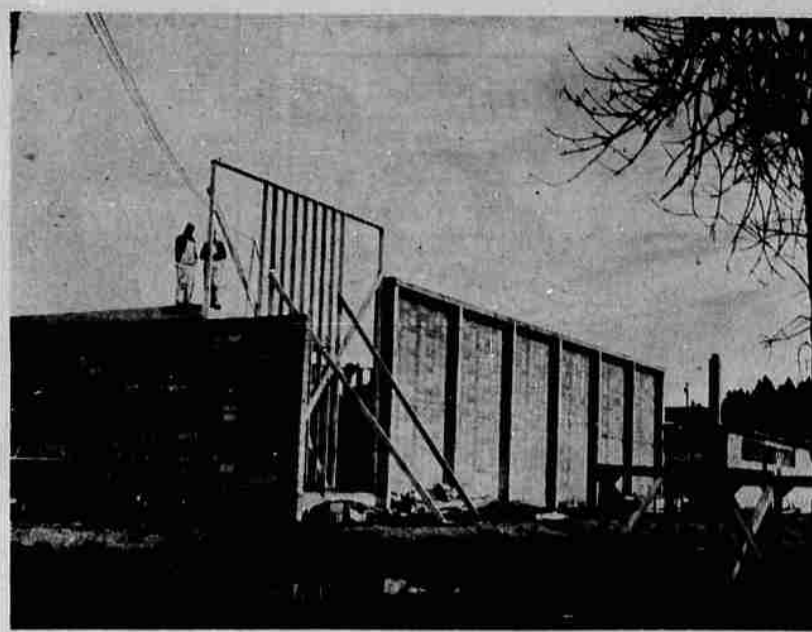
Sunday at 11 a.m. the pastor, the Rev. Ingward Olsen, speaks on "What Are the Marks of a Consecrated Christian?"
