out of its 18th and Chambers St. location in the November election.

He added that the first stage in the plan should be financed with funds equal to the full market value of Airpark land, regardless of whether the Airpark is traded to School District 4 or other agencies.

Such improvements could be undertaken for about \$133,000. This would include the 30 hangars, facilities for a fixed base operator, and paved taxi aprons, utilities and other factors.

Fisher also told the committee and the Chamber representatives that the city should plan to close the Airpark to flying operations no later than September of this year. It will take that long to provide the replacement facilities at Mahlon Sweet.

HELIPORT ONLY

Fisher's enthusiasm for the Mahlon Sweet development brought questions about the proposed community air facility now between Eugene and Springfield.

The consultant said the area would be a good location for a heliport (heliporter) facility, which would include a simple light plane landing strip, but anything else would be "an obstacle course, and as far as I am concerned, from a public participation viewpoint, would be uneconomical."

Fisher said a series of high radio transmitting antennas and homes in the district immediately north of the river would make a landing facility there a "visual airport." He estimated that construction to meet minimum requirements for a medium landing field would take at least \$250,000. And the facility would not provide for all-weather flying.

He urged that community leaders combine efforts and enthusiasm in development of Mahlon Sweet into a "top-notch" airport for all types of airplanes. With a good fixed-base operator, and such enthusiasm "Eugene could have the best airport in the Pacific Northwest," he said.

NO ALTERNATIVE

Alton Lenhart, chairman of the Chamber of Commerce Aviation Committee, said he could see "no alternative" but to get behind plans for development of Mahlon Sweet Field. He said he believes with development of the city's large airport, transportation difficulties will be overcome.

George Hemphill, another member of the Chamber committee, said he has changed his mind about the proposal at Mahlon Sweet. "I think it is the only thing we can do in view of the money we have."

Hemphill called for expenditures that will equal the full market value of the displaced Airpark. "The city is obligated," he said.

"He (Fisher) has convinced me that we should have one operation (at Mahlon Sweet Field) and I think we should go to work on it."

Motorists Get Money Back

POCATELLO, Idaho (AP)—Police here are asking motorists who paid fines or forfeited bonds because they didn't have their 1955 license plates on time to please come take their money back.

Gov. Robert E. Smylie requested last Saturday that arrests of motorists who missed the Jan. 1 deadline be stopped until Jan. 20.

The only trouble is that Smylie, who took office Jan. 3, made his request a week after the deadline. In that time, a lot of tickets had already been handed out.

The mayor of Boise, Idaho's capital city, has openly defied Smylie and ordered police to continue making arrests. But over most of the state, law officials are going along with the request, albeit reluctantly.

Pocatello is the only city to start refunding fines already levied. It announced the move Monday, but only a handful of refund-seeking motorists showed up to collect their money Tuesday.

The guest speaker said that the per capita consumption of eggs in America during the past year was 412. The normal consumption is about 400 eggs, he said, but still there was an overproduction, amounting to about 420 for each person.

He said that 1954 was "one of the roughest years on poultrymen in the history of the industry." Forecasts for 1955 show that business should improve during the latter half of the year, he said.

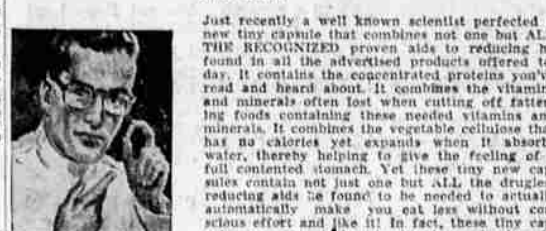
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Rotary Club Hears 4-H, FFA Reports

State of Siege Extended

PANAMA (AP)—The National Assembly Tuesday night extended for 10 more days the state of siege declared following the assassination Jan. 2 of President Jose Antonio Remon.

As it had in originally voting the modified form of martial law, the Assembly said its purpose was to facilitate the so far fruitless investigation into the machine-gunning of Remon. The original decree would have expired Thursday.

The state of siege, under which most constitutional guarantees are suspended, has had little effect on everyday life in the capital. Mainly it has enabled investigators to arrest persons for questioning without warrants, and those arrested are unable to obtain freedom by habeas corpus proceedings.

Minister of Government Catalino Arrocha told the Assembly the search for the late president's slayers had produced no concrete results so far. Following the killing, about 70 persons were arrested in the capital but many of these have since been released.

13 Hunters Killed

PORTLAND (AP)—The Oregon State Game Commission Tuesday reported that 13 persons were killed and 37 wounded in Oregon hunting accidents during 1954.

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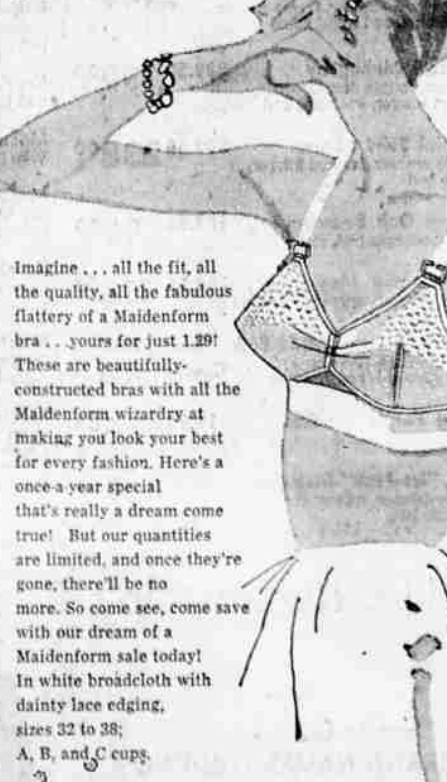
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
