NEW YORK (AP)—Little Greek-born Roni Marie should be a happy child Friday. She has two adoring foster parents, a new tooth and all the diapers she'll ever need.

The pert, 17-month-old foundling arrived in this country Thursday with her new dad, Navy Lt. Norman (Moose) Donahoe, after a delayed flight from Athens.

After landing at the Patuxent, Md., naval base, the pair went to Washington by car and arrived here by train Thursday night to

meet the little girl's new mother Helen.

The meeting in Pennsylvania Station was emotional.

QUICK CHANGE

Mrs. Donahoe, speechless at first could only cry for joy. Her 28-year-old husband shed a few tears himself.

Roni Marie let out a yowl and extended her arms to Papa Donahoe.

With an understanding born of experience, Donahoe whisked Roni Marie onto a counter in the stationmaster's office, whipped out a fresh diaper from a briefcase, and made a quick change.

Roni Marie stopped crying and flashed her first smile at her new mom.

Wiping her eyes, Mrs. Donahoe hugged Roni Marie and kept repeating, "I love you, I love you, I love you."

Roni Marie gurgled appreciatively.

'JUST LIKE MOM'

"Look," said Mrs. Donahoe, she's getting a new tooth.

"She's teething," Donahoe replied, "but she's been a wonderful, wonderful baby."

"No temper?" he was asked.

"Oh, yes, she has a temper—just like her mother," said the lieutenant, winking at his wife, who is of Greek parentage.

The Donahoes, married five years, never had any children.

They decided to adopt a Greek child after finding they could do so without the long wait necessary in this country. Donahoe flew to Greece a month ago.

Special Hunt To Eliminate Buffalo Herd

FT. HUACHUCA, Ariz. (AP)—One by one, hunters are systematically shooting away in a special hunt aimed at eliminating one of the last large buffalo herds in the West.

Each one has got his buffalo.

Before the hunt was begun here under the auspices of the Arizona Game and Fish Commission Wednesday, there were about 300 buffaloes on this military reservation. About 60 will be left. They will be shipped to a Northern Arizona ranch.

The shoot was undertaken after military authorities complained the beasts were disturbing military housing.

Here is how it works: Hunters, chosen by lot, stand partially concealed by bushes at the end of a 200-foot runway.

The buffaloes, which have been herded into corrals, are chased out of their pens into the runway.

As the animals trot out of the end of the barbed-wire enclosures, hunters open fire. Average range is about 20 yards.

Mounted state game rangers stand by to turn the buffaloes back toward the hunters if they miss.

The shooting and turning continue until the animal is dead, or so disabled that its throat can be cut.

Each hunter gets a quarter of meat. The other three-quarters are for sale by the commission at \$25 apiece.

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New Highway Plan Proposed

Would be Substitute For 'Strategic Roads'

WASHINGTON (AP)—A national toll highway network was proposed Friday as a substitute for a presidential commission's recommendation that the federal government build strategic roads.

H. E. Bailey, recently resigned as general manager of the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority, said the government financing plan would be used by "forces of reaction . . . to pass the buck to the federal government for responsibility for all classes of highways."

In an address prepared for a national road conference sponsored by the U. S. Chamber of Commerce, he said that a 1939 report of the Bureau of Public Roads opposing toll financing had "delayed the development of a national trunk highway system for 15 years."

REVENUE BONDS
Gen. Lucius D. Clay, chairman of President Eisenhower's commission, told the conference at its opening session Thursday that "toll roads are here to stay" but that he didn't think very much of toll financing.

Robert T. Jones Jr., president of the Houston Chronicle, said the Clay committee plan would end any need for further toll roads.

The Clay commission called for a total federal-state highway program of 101 billion dollars over the next 10 years. It suggested the federal government provide 25 billion of the cost of a proposed 40,000-mile interstate highway system through revenue bonds floated by a new highway corporation. Clay said gasoline tax revenues over the next 30 years would be more than enough to pay for this program.

Bailey, instead, called for repeal of the 2-cent-a-gallon federal gasoline tax. He suggested "that source of revenue be left entirely to the states."

NATIONAL AUTHORITY
He asked that the federal government set up a national turnpike authority and provide \$1.416,000,000 a year for highway work from excise taxes on autos, trucks, oils, tires and parts.

Under Bailey's program, the entire 40,000-mile interstate network would be made up of toll roads financed by joint funds from state and federal turnpike authorities. In sparsely populated areas the federal government would pay the entire construction cost.

A toll fee of 1 to 1½ cents a mile would be charged to automobiles and 2 to 4 cents a mile to trucks. Proceeds would be used for maintenance and the retirement of bonds issued by the states to finance their part of the system.

Estate Goes to Charity
PORTLAND (AP)—Probate court records disclosed Friday that the bulk of a \$265,000 estate of the late Howard J. Teel was left to the Shriners' Hospital for Crippled Children. The former Portland plywood dealer, who died Dec. 8, a bachelor, left all but \$28,000 of the estate to charity. Other beneficiaries included the National Polio Foundation and the Goodwill Industries.
