Catholics Rally To Support Bans Of Decency Legion

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Catholic Bishops of the United States have called on all Catholics to comply faithfully with their pledge to shun motion pictures which are found objectionable by the Legion of Decency.

They also recently reminded movie critics for Catholic publications that it is their primary obligation to judge a motion picture on its moral values. A film's technical or artistic value should be given secondary consideration, they said.

Catholics annually take a pledge to avoid films found by the Legion of Decency to be dangerous to their moral life.

The conference said the Legion condemned two of the 279 Hollywood films it reviewed this year. Of the 73 foreign films the Legion reviewed, seven were condemned.

The Rev. Frank G. Ricker, executive secretary of the Pacific Coast Unitarian Council, will speak Sunday morning at the Eugene Unitarian Church. At 1:30 p.m. he will conduct an area meeting to plan the annual United Unitarian Appeal. All local members who are able to attend the meeting at the church are urged to do so.

The Rev. Mr. Ricker was called from the ministry of the Unitarian Church of Columbus, Ohio to his present position in September, 1948.

During his four years in Columbus, the church membership was tripled, a site facing the Ohio State Campus purchased, and the first unit of a modern functional building erected. For a year he had also served as executive director of the Columbus Council for Democracy, a local civic unit organization. He had also served as regional director for the Meadville Unitarian Conference, counseling with churches in Quebec, Ontario, and parts of New York, Ohio, and Pennsylvania.

His earlier pastorates were in Waltham and Medfield, Massachusetts.

Born in Washington, D.C., educated on Long Island, New York, and at the University of Maine, he prepared for the ministry at the Andover-Newton Theological School. He has had experience in real estate and advertising, and has given frequent religious broadcasts on the Ohio State University station.

SDA Church Debt-Free For Dedication

The Eugene Seventh-day Adventist Church, located at 13th and Polk Streets, will be dedicated, debt free, at a special service Saturday afternoon, Jan. 29, 1955, is announced by D. D. Doleman, pastor of the local congregation.

The building, designed by Architect Robert F. Fisher of Grants Pass, Oregon, was begun in the summer of 1951. In June of 1952 the congregation moved from their old building at Seventh and Charnell Streets, which had been their church home for over thirty years, to their new \$130,000 structure.

The edifice has received much favorable comment as an example of contemporary church architecture, according to the Rev. Mr. Doleman. The nave is 1120 feet long and 47 feet wide and provides a seating capacity for more than 500 in upholstered pews. Wall to wall green carpeting blends with the green walls and light oak furnishings. Much of the east exposure of the nave is glass. The choir loft and pipe organ are located in the rear of the Sanctuary on a balcony.

A large rostrum extends the full width of the nave and contains the divided Chancel furniture. One of the most unique features of the building is the large brick planter on the rostrum which is filled with many varieties of tropical plants. This feature, with the Roman tile wall behind it has suggested the name "The Garden Chapel."

January Is Unity Month For Catholics

Every January Catholics the world over observe a prayer for the unity of all Christendom and, oddly enough, the octave of prayer was originated by a man who wasn't a Catholic.

The "Chair of Unity Octave," which opens Jan. 18, the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter, and closes January 25, the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, was originated by Father Paul James Francis, an Anglican, in 1908 at Graymoor Monastery in Garrison, New York.

Father Paul, who was born Lewis Thomas Wattson, founded the Society of the Atonement in 1893. He was for years the leader of the pro-Catholic group in the Anglican communion in the United States and his publication, The Lamp, reflected his convictions.

The founding of the Church Unity Octave, as it was originally called, was almost the last work of Father Paul as an Anglican clergyman for a year later he began negotiations with Catholic authorities that led to the acceptance of the entire Society of Atonement — 18 persons — into the Catholic Church on the morning of October 30, 1909.

The Octave has grown ever since and is observed now in parishes all over the world. The name was changed so there would be no confusion about the intent, which is that all Christendom might be united or re-united with the Catholic Church.

The specific intentions of the Octave are: Jan. 18, The return of the "other sheep" (Jan. 19, The return of Oriental Separatists; The return of Anglicans; Jan. 21, The return of Lutherans and other Protestants of Continental Europe; Jan. 22, for Christian Unity in America; Jan. 23, Return of lapsed Catholics; Jan. 24, The conversion of the Jews; Jan. 25, The missionary conquest of the world.

Lutheran Guest On Television

Paul Friedrich, executive director of the Lutheran Laymen's League, will be the guest on the CBS television show "Lamp Unto My Feet" Jan. 16. The show originates in New York City.

As director of the 80,000 member organization, Friedrich has a part in the league's many projects including the world famous radio program The Lutheran Hour.

Other league projects include The Family Worship Hour, a 15-minute daily devotional program; Christian films; tours; program for men's clubs; placement service; a monthly newspaper; and a broad program of Christian service.

Prior to assuming his present position with the Lutheran Laymen's League, Friedrich served as executive secretary of the Cranbrook Institutions in Bloomfield Hills, Mich. His 17 years with that institution included terms as registrar and business manager.

A graduate of the University of Wisconsin, Friedrich is a past president of the Michigan chapter of the Educational Buyers Association; a member of the editorial board of "College and University Business;" and of the Detroit Commission on Industry and Education.

He is a member of the executive board of Lutheran Television Productions which produces "This Is the Life."
