1954 May Be Considered Year We Forgot Depression Fears

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market crash of 1929 was an economic Pearl Harbor. It killed some people, the men who committed suicide, or died of heart attacks beside the tickers. It struck down the hopes of many others. And ultimately, through the great depression that swiftly followed, it hit the life of every American.
Nobody ever will be able to wholly assess the effects of those tragic years. How much did they set back the economic growth of America? How deep a sense of insecurity did they leave?
Harry D. Comer, partner-analyst in a major New York broker firm, recently wrote:
"1954 may well be considered by future generations as a turning point in our history. . . . Certainly, it will long be remembered as the year when America conquered the depression phobia."
Long books have analyzed the 1929 catastrophe. They show speculation, rigging and other sharp practices. Such was the fever of the times that people bought a stock without knowing what that company produced—or if it produced anything.
DIFFERENT TODAY
Things are different today because of regulations that did not exist then.
Did the stock market crash cause the great depression of the 1930's?
Comer prefers to say it "triggered" the slump. Other factors existed. It dramatized and aggravated them.
Moreover, set in motion a chain reaction of contractions.
People cut back on buying and spending. They were scared. Sales dropped. Production slowed. Unemployment set in. The banks were scared too. Some had failed. They called in notes. Everybody lost confidence.
And confidence is like the film of oil that supports tons of machinery. To a considerable degree, the whole towering American economy rides on it.

Thornton Rule Reversed
SALEM (AP)—The Oregon Supreme Court, reversing a ruling by Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton, held this week that attorneys who are members of the Legislature can represent claimants before the State Industrial Accident Commission.
Thornton had ruled that legislators couldn't do this because the Constitution bars legislators from doing business with the state.
The high court, however, said that cases before the accident commission are not cases against the state.
The decision involves State Rep. Ben Anderson, Portland Democrat, member of a firm handling cases against the accident commission. However, it affects other members of the Legislature, too.
The Supreme Court, whose decision was by Justice Hall S. Lusk, held that such actions are not actions against the state, because the state has no interest in the accident fund, which is set aside solely for injured workmen.

King-Size' Tax
COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—Republican Rep. Robert E. Zellars has introduced a measure in the State Legislature to raise the tax on "king-size" cigarettes from 2 to 3 cents a pack. Zellars himself smokes neither long nor regular-size cigarettes. He rolls his own.
