

Sausage And Sauerkraut At Big Dinner

Verboort Catholic Church near Forest Grove has established a unique reputation by giving sauerkraut and sausage dinners. They have started the custom in several other communities where some of their members have migrated. Now they plan to come to St. Alice Catholic Church at Springfield to help the local parish in preparing and serving a dinner.

Six families moved to the Verboort area in 1870. The community has about 100 families now who belong to the Visitation church. Many of these are related to Father Louis Sohler of St. Alice in Springfield. In fact there are five generations of his family presently there. Many of his close relatives are active in the dinner projects and will be in Springfield on February 19th. An uncle Henry (Hank) Sohler has made this year's batch of sauerkraut which Father Sohler has sampled and pronounced "the best ever."

Springfield's first dinner like this has been set for February 19th in the American Legion Hall. Committees and plans are in the making.

Dr. Jesse M. 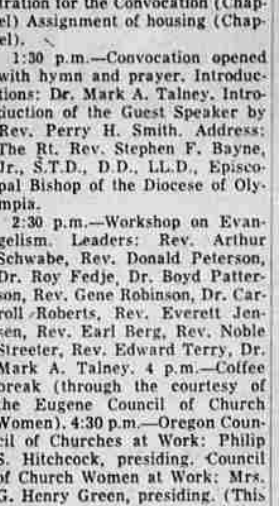
