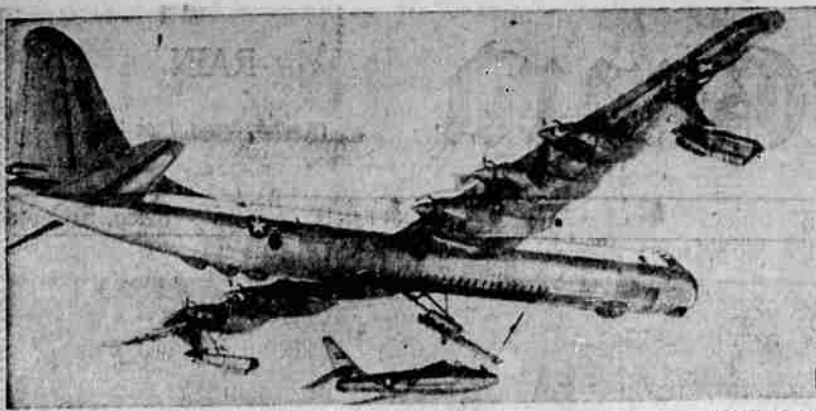

## Nationalists Promise Fight For Islands

### Determination Said Absolute

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP)—Chinese Communists Friday fired 52 shells at the Nationalist Chinese island of Quemoy, the defense ministry announced. The ministry did not say whether the defenders returned the fire.

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP)—Chiang Kai-shek's Chinese Nationalists are determined to fight for their offshore islands Quemoy and Matsu, with or without American support, Premier O. K. Yui asserted Friday.

Nationalist determination to defend the islands is absolute, the premier told the Legislative Yuan (Parliament) in reply to questions.

Other civilian planes scouted southwestern Wyoming. And searchers awaited word from a ground party which had pushed into another section of the jumbled Wasatch Mountains Thursday afternoon to investigate a report a low-flying plane was heard groping through a rain-storm Wednesday night. This was about 40 miles north of the spot where wreckage was reported seen 500 feet below the 11,750-foot summit of Mt. Timpanogos from an Air Force plane. The sound of a circling plane also had been reported in that area Wednesday night.

Yui said the Nationalists have proved their determination to defend Quemoy and Matsu since last Sept. 3, the day the Reds poured 6,000 shells into Quemoy, killing 2 American officers in the barrage.

Yui said that since then the Nationalists on Quemoy, a 50 square mile island 120 miles west of Formosa, had retaliated shell for shell.

EVACUATION URGED  
"Our determination to continue hitting back," he said, "has not changed — and will not change."

The renewed warnings against possible air raids was followed by a statement by Mayor Kao Yu-Shu that Taipei's shelters would accommodate only 200,000 out of a population of 700,000. He suggested that some 300,000 old people, women and children be classed as non-essential and moved out of the city.

## Mixed Reaction Greet's Ike's Pledge of Troops

PARIS (AP)—President Eisenhower's pledge that the United States will maintain troops in Europe if the Paris agreements on West German rearmament are ratified won a warm welcome Friday in West Germany. But Paris newspaper comment was cool.

Eisenhower made the promise Thursday in parallel messages to the prime ministers of the 7 nations to be enrolled in the projected West European Union. He said if the Paris agreements were put into effect the United States would keep in West Europe its "fair share" of the forces needed for defense of that area.

In Bonn, an official West German spokesman said the President's assurances appeared stronger than the similar pledge Eisenhower made last year in connection with the now-defunct European Defense Community.

The German said especially noteworthy was the emphasis the President put on close cooperation with the WEU members—Britain, France, West Germany, Italy, Belgium, The Netherlands and Luxembourg.

The influential Paris newspaper Le Figaro, however, said Eisenhower "implies that the United States will continue to take an interest in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization only

if the Paris agreements are ratified." This meant, the newspaper added, that American reactions "would be serious, not to say catastrophic," if the agreements were rejected.

Seven of the 15 nations involved in the treaties have completed parliamentary action. The pacts still face upper house votes in both France and West Germany, the nations where they have had their hardest sledding.

## French to Try To Conquer Mt. Makalu

PARIS (AP)—Eleven Frenchmen are about to undertake a conquest of the fifth highest mountain in the world—27,780-foot Mt. Makalu, on the border of Nepal and Tibet.

Twenty miles east of Everest, Makalu is swept by the same icy winds of the high Himalayas. On it last year a group of Californians led by Dr. William Siri was beaten back by storms and avalanches at 23,000 feet.

The French feel new equipment will help them scale the peak. An advance group made a reconnaissance of approaches last October.

The French team hopes to have its base camp established by April 19 and an advanced base ready a month later. The main assault will be in May.

The expedition, organized by the French Mountain Federation and the French Alpine Club, is headed by Jean Franco. At 40 he is the oldest member of the team; the youngest is 26.

Franco said the expedition plans to adopt the strategy of the British expedition in May, 1953. Advance camps will be built at intervals up the mountain from the base camp, each one smaller in size than the last below it. The top-most camp will have tent space for 2 men who will make the last try for the summit.

The team's improved equipment will include radio sets weighing only 6 pounds and tents—"nylon outside and silk within"—which can withstand 90-mile-an-hour winds, Franco said. There will also be better oxygen apparatus, clothing and boots.

Playboy Waits Divorce Ruling  
CIUDAD TRUJILLO, Dominican Republic (AP)—The testimony is over in Porfirio Rubirosa's suit for a divorce from Barbara Hutton. But—the judge has two months to make up his mind.

That's just 12 days less than Rubi and Babs were married before announcing their "friendly separation" March 13, 1954, in Palm Beach, Fla.

The Dominican playboy-diplomat's request for legal severance from his latest mistress wife came before Judge Anibal Sosa Ortiz here yesterday. Rubi's suit said their characters are incompatible.

Rubirosa was in Miami, Fla., preparing for a sports car race. His wife was last reported in Honolulu.

## Air Wreck Sighted On Utah Mountain

SALT LAKE CITY (AP)—Ground searchers faced the towering hazard of snow-covered Mt. Timpanogos Friday in their effort to discover which—if either—of 2 lost planes crashed near the summit.

Wreckage was sighted late Thursday.

The planes with a total of 10 persons aboard—5 in a civilian Beechcraft from Chicago and 5 in an Air Force B25 bomber from

Great Falls, Mont.—have been missing since Wednesday night.

## Senate Gets GI Pay Bill

WASHINGTON (AP)—Rep. Kilday (D-Tex.) said Friday many congressmen hope that prospects of higher pay will attract enough volunteers into the armed services to permit "reducing or eliminating the draft."

He cited this as one of several possible reasons for virtual House unanimity Thursday in voting 399-1 to give career servicemen pay boosts ranging from 6 and 25 per cent. Rep. Tabor (R-NY) cast the only negative vote.

The measure, which now goes to the Senate, provides an average 11.9 per cent increase for enlisted men and warrant officers with over three years' service. It also increases special pay for hazardous air and submarine duty and boosts some other fringe benefits. The total yearly cost is estimated at 745 million dollars.

Some two million servicemen would be eligible for the increases.

The House action merely authorized the increases; funds will be voted later.

President Eisenhower strongly supported the bill and said it is necessary to keep trained men from leaving the service for better-paying civilian jobs.

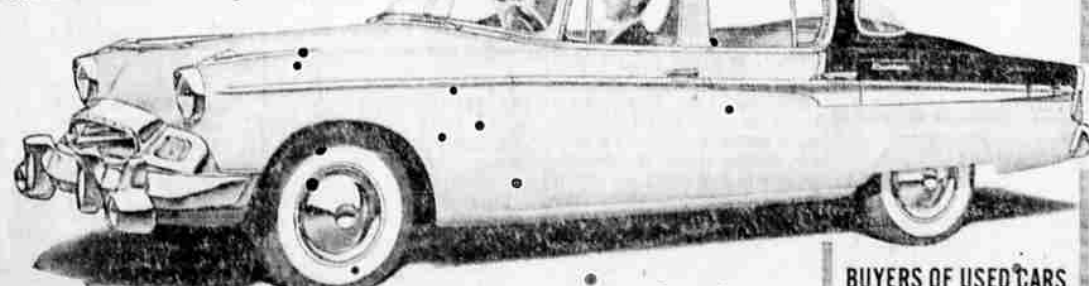
