The couple now is at home at 3423 Coburg Rd.



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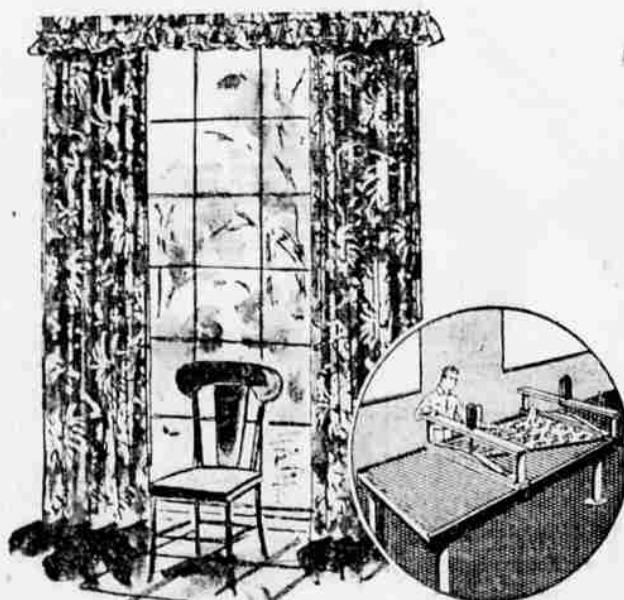
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
