Co-Op Health Plan Outlined

Dr. W. A. MacColl told a Lane County audience Saturday night that cooperative medical service is a truly American approach to the problem of health.

He said that, "The pooling of resources and energies to meet a common need is as characteristic an approach as the hot dog or, more locally, the Submarine Sandwich."

Dr. MacColl, executive director of the Group Health Cooperative of Puget Sound at Seattle, was brought to Eugene by the Lane Health Cooperative—a group of local persons now planning a cooperative medical plan for the Eugene area.

The guest speaker, whose organization has some 9,000 member families served by 36 physicians, listed these advantages of cooperative medicine:

- The patient has an interest and voice in policy formation.
- It offers preventive and educational services.
- It is "a buffer against both catastrophic costs and the chronic drain of small items."
- It has predictable medical costs.
- Consultant services are available without economic barriers.
- There is a parallel interest in keeping the patient well, shared by doctor and patient.

Dr. MacColl also spoke to a number of groups interested in cooperative medicine and toured Sacred Heart Hospital.

The local group intends to begin taking memberships early in April. Plans are to function from rental quarters at first and employ 4 doctors. At least at the outset, persons requiring hospitalization will be sent to existing facilities.
