Big Airliner Crash Lands
CHICAGO (AP)—Sixty passengers and 6 crew members all escaped injury when a big airliner nosed into the ground on an emergency landing here Sunday. Afterward, entertainer Connie Boswell sang, "We Came in on a Wing and a Prayer."
The passengers got a shaking up—but nothing worse—when the nose wheel of an American Airlines DC7 collapsed on landing at Midway Airport.
The plane was on a nonstop flight from Los Angeles to New York when 1 engine began sputtering east of Chicago. Capt. R. A. Patterson, of Los Angeles, headed the ship back to Chicago for a landing.
Miss Boswell, who sang from a wheel chair—she is a polio cripple—as one of the Boswell Sisters and her husband Harry Leedy were on their way to New York to make records.
The passengers continued to New York in a later plane.

Family Rate Announced For EHS Demonstration

For 50 cents, an entire family may see the physical education demonstration by 300 Eugene High School boys and girls Friday, March 25, at 8 p.m. in the school gym.
Willard Burke, head of the physical education and health department at EHS, said the special rate is designed to keep the budget down and also to familiarize large numbers of citizens about the school's PE program.
Admission prices will be 25 cents for single adults and 10 cents for students. This is the first time that such a program has been presented by Eugene High in which both boys and girls take part.
Proceeds from the event will be used to purchase athletic items which the school has not been financially able to obtain. The program will last about 1½ hours and will consist partly of demonstrations on use of equipment, games, rhythmic and related events.

Shrew Said Major Forest Enemy

Taming of the shrew will be necessary before Northwest forests can take place. Formerly, foresters presumed that shrews were insect and worm-eaters and that deer mice were major offenders.
They are fond of seeds, these shrews. During captive observation, they ate from 185 to 250 seeds in a day. In the field, they gobbled up from 50 to 100 per cent of all fir seeds placed in likely spots within 3-day test periods.

EATEN IN SPRING
Even Sitka spruce seeds are not safe from the shrews, which eat them in large amounts. These had been considered safe from seed-eating mammals.
Most seeds were eaten in the spring, when food is scarce.
Kangur has established, says the board, that control of the shrew is a must for any successful direct seeding project.

MOUSE-LIKE MAMMAL
The shrew is a small, mouse-like mammal with a long, pointed snout, small eyes, and velvety hair. It can eat its weight in valuable Douglas fir or spruce seeds every 24 hours.
The "Log" refers to a bulletin on shrews and tree-seed eaters in the Douglas fir region. The bulletin was written by Rudolph Kangur, research forester for the board of forestry.
It stresses that a year's battle may be necessary to control the shrew if there is to be assurance that sufficient natural seeding

Former Convict To Speak Here
A former convict who turned from a life of crime to Christianity will speak at the Eugene Hotel Tuesday evening at a meeting sponsored by the Christian Business Men's Committee of Eugene. The meeting will start at 6:30 p.m.
Phil Thatcher, founder and director of New Life Youth Camps, will tell his life story—from reform school escapee to Folsom Prison lifer to a leader in juvenile work.
In the 1920's Thatcher served 4 years in San Quentin Prison for armed robbery. After parole, he became involved in a series of armed robberies with sawed-off shotguns and ended up in Folsom State Prison with a 10-year life sentence.
One day he picked up a Bible in his cell and started reading it. Shortly thereafter, he was converted to Christianity.

Witness at Red Hearing Swings On Photographer
SEATTLE (AP)—A news photographer was slammed against a wall Saturday when he snapped a picture of a man whose name had been mentioned by a witness at a House Un-American Activities Committee hearing.
Roy Atkinson, a Seattle insurance man, was restrained immediately by police. He did not face a police charge.
Atkinson's name had been mentioned by Eugene V. Bennett, a witness, as one who had applied for Communist Party membership between 1932 and 1947. The application, the witness said, was rejected because they feared he might be an informer and otherwise doubted his interest.
Ron DaRosa, photographer for the Seattle Times, snapped a picture of Atkinson in the corridor outside the hearing room and was thrown against a wall.
"He took a punch at my camera," DaRosa said, "but I don't think it's damaged. Didn't hurt me a bit."
