Metropolitan Contralto Sings at U of O Friday

Claramae Turner, contralto star of opera and concert, will appear at McArthur Court, Friday, at 8 p.m. under sponsorship of the Civic Music Assn.

She has made 5 nation-wide concert tours and has appeared in American opera companies from coast to coast. These include the Metropolitan and San Francisco Operas, and others.

Claramae Turner's appearance in Eugene will be one of the highlights of the Eugene music season, according to Dr. G. B. Hull, president of CMA. Admission will be by CMA ticket only.

Miss Turner was acclaimed at the "Met" where she made her debut in such important roles as Amneris in the most popular of all of Verdi's operas, "Aida." She always includes in her concert programs some of her most famous operatic arias.

During her high school days she studied music with Maude Homan Riley in her home town of Eureka, Calif. After she was graduated, she went to San Francisco to join the chorus of the San Francisco opera.

For several years she sang on the West Coast, appearing also with such eminent conductors as

NEW YORK (AP)—It's hilarious, simply hilarious, being a television comedy writer.

Just a few days ago the 2 writers of the Martha Raye Show were sitting in their elaborate triple cell, high up in a Manhattan tower. They had been locked up together for more than 2 weeks. But now they were too stunned even to detest each other.

Said Ed Simmons to Norman Lear: "If only we spent all our time watching television, we wouldn't have time to write stuff that gets us into trouble."

Lear nodded numbly. With rehearsals about to begin, with sets and costumes well along in production, with only a few score hours to actual performance, they had just finished, after 2 weeks work, a script satirizing Jackie Gleason. And then someone gave them the word: Both Milton Berle and Red Skelton had done the same thing recently.

"I think we ought to hire some invalid or shut-in to do nothing but watch TV for us," said Simmons.

Bolivia Uses Army to Fill New Farms

LA PAZ, Bolivia (AP)—Food-short Bolivia is planning a gradual migration of its Indian peasants to open new farmlands in the untitled East.

Eighteen months of agrarian reform have failed to feed Bolivia's 3,100,000 inhabitants. For one thing, it takes a lot of surveyors to cut up great tracts of farm land. For another, the Bolivian Indian has to be urged to drop his habit of centuries and grow more than enough for his own family's needs.

So Bolivia still must import at least \$25 million worth of food-stuffs yearly. In its inflationary crisis, millions of dollars worth of food come as a gift from the United States.

Emphasis now is not so much on agrarian reform as on the migration plan. The government plans to move people from the highlands of western Bolivia to the vast and sparsely settled plains of eastern Bolivia around Santa Cruz.

How does the government expect to get the Indians to leave their old homes for the new?

"Every man must do 1 year of military service when he is 19 years old," Paz Estenssoro said. "We will take the conscripts to the Santa Cruz region and put them to work on the land there as part of their military service. When the year is up each man will be offered a farm of his own to which he can bring his family from the highlands. We believe many of the men will want to stay."

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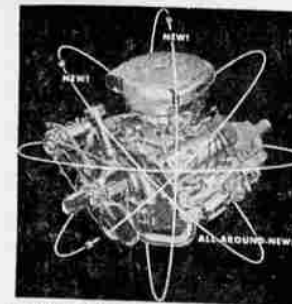


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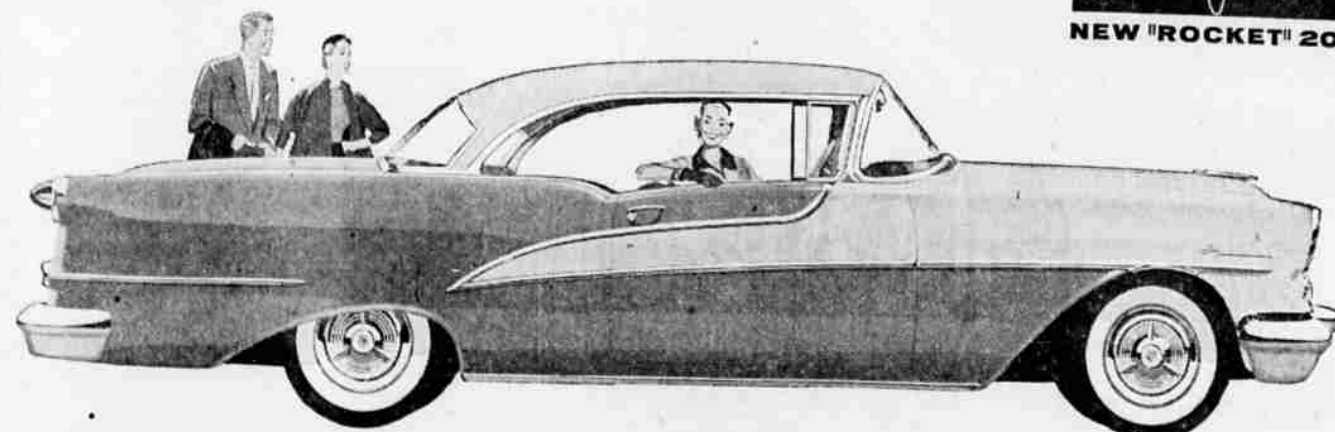
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
