Corvallis Policemen Fired After Admitting Thefts

CORVALLIS — Three Corvallis police officers were fired Wednesday after they admitted stealing items from a store during an investigation.

Police Chief Cecil Pruitt said the three took merchandise with a total value of \$57.60 from the Montgomery Ward store after finding the door open Sunday night.

Dismissed were Noble C. Stewart, 28; A. E. Bodeker, 41, and James H. Gundy Jr., 32. Stewart had been on the force three years and Bodeker and Gundy six years each.

The officers pleaded guilty in District Court to charges of petty larceny and were fined \$30 and paroled from 90 day jail sentences.

Most valuable item taken was a skillaworth worth \$54.95. Other items taken included a file, flashlight batteries and three boxes of 22 caliber shells. Pruitt said the three admitted the theft when confronted with the evidence.

Objectors Sentenced

PORTLAND — Two conscientious objectors were sentenced to six months in prison in Federal Court here Wednesday for draft evasion. They were Gale Hallett, 21-year-old Jehovah's Witness from Portland and Albert Stain, 27-year-old Salem member of the Church of God.

Judge Claude McColloch allowed Stain to remain free on bail after his attorney, G. Bernhard Fedde, said he would appeal.

Damage Suit Filed

PORTLAND — An \$66,500 damage suit has been filed in Federal Court here by the widow and daughter of a Medford man killed in a sawmill accident last December. The suit was filed by Mrs. Mildred Dunford, and her daughter, Kay, against the Medford corporation.

Norman Dunford, 59, was killed while operating an edger. A chunk of wood was thrown against his chest and abdomen when the edger fouled.

Reduction Approved

SALEM — Public Utilities Commissioner Charles H. Heltzel gave Pacific Power & Light Co. permission Wednesday to reduce its rates. The reduction, effective next Friday, amounts to \$242,000 a year in the company's Coos Bay division, and \$60,000 in the Willamette Valley.

Heltzel said the reductions are a result of the company's merger with Mountain States Power Co.

Truman Scheduled

SALEM — Former President Harry Truman will speak June 11 at a Northwest regional fund raising dinner in Portland, according to word received here Wednesday from Democratic National Chairman Paul Butler.

Butler said the fund raising affair would involve states of Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana.

Chinese Leader Dies

PORTLAND — Mrs. Stanley Chin, 58, a leading figure in Chinese women's affairs here for many years, died Tuesday.

She was a leader of the Portland League of Women Voters, formed the first Chinese Girl Reserves unit in the YWCA here some 20 years ago, and had lectured extensively in Oregon on Chinese affairs.

Mrs. Chin was born Feb. 18, 1897, at Vancouver, Wash. Her grandfather, Seid Back, contracted a large part of the Chinese labor for Northwest and Alaska canneries in the latter part of the 19th century.

Cattlemen to Meet

CORVALLIS — Members of the Oregon Cattlemen's Assn. will meet here May 8-11 in the association's annual convention. Principal speaker will be Rep. Sam Coon (R-Ore). Main order of business will be discussions of a proposed "beef commission."

Ships to Be Moved

ASTORIA — Six ships will be moved to Astoria piers this week to be prepared for storage of surplus grain. The first of the 75 storage ships arrived Tuesday from the reserve fleet in the Columbia River east of here. Loading of the ships is expected to get under way within a few weeks.

Norblad Urges Burial of Ship

WASHINGTON — Rep. Walter Norblad (R-Ore.) Wednesday urged that the battleship Oregon, veteran of the Spanish-American war, be given a proper military burial "with all possible honors."

The ship, stripped of all fittings, was used as a breakwater at Guam during the war and is still at the Pacific island. Norblad said the cost of towing the hull to Portland had been explored and found prohibitive, and its value for scrap was "questionable."

The Oregon Republican, in a letter to Rear Admiral W. D. Leggett, Chief of the Navy's Bureau of Ships in Washington, urged that the admiral take appropriate action and arrange for the Oregon's burial, "with appropriate patriotic ceremonies."
