Chief Urges Driving Habit Inventory

With most motorists spending more time on the road as summer approaches, it's a good time to take inventory of personal driving habits, Harold Cowles, Springfield's acting chief of police, suggested Thursday.

"We can all sharpen up our knowledge of traffic laws," he declared, "for we may be disobeying some of them, unintentionally."

Cowles said that 90 per cent of all accidents occur within 25 miles of where the drivers live. Also, 90 per cent of drivers involved in accidents hold valid operator's licenses, showing they have passed driving tests.

Cowles said a total of 420 persons died in Oregon traffic accidents last year and another 13,888 suffered injuries. The total number of accidents in Oregon last year was 59,839.

Health Co-op Meets Friday
Charles O. Porter, Eugene attorney, will be the temporary chairman Friday night when the Lane Health Cooperative holds its organizational meeting.

The new organization seeks to provide prepaid medical care for 1,000 local families initially, later expanding. Several doctors are to be hired and others are to be on a consulting basis. Plans are that rental quarters will be used at first.

Those who sign membership applications Friday night will be considered shareholders and will vote on proposed bylaws and service agreements. This group also will elect a board of trustees and officers, who in turn will designate committee assignments.

At the meeting, to begin at 8 p.m. in the Lane Electric Co-op Building on Franklin Blvd., Bryce Thalman will explain the possibility of establishing a credit union as an affiliate of the medical co-operative.

Police Seek Lost Checks

Eugene police said Friday they are still searching for a large number of checks taken this week in an armed robbery at the Amazon Market, 1711 W. 11th Ave., Eugene.

Some of the checks and about \$100 in cash were reported recovered shortly after the holdup Monday night when three men were arrested and charged with the crime.

The trio, Moses Moody, Franklin Collins and Richard Earl Murray, are in the Eugene jail awaiting a preliminary hearing on the armed robbery charge. They were arrested by a Junction City policeman shortly after the robbery as they drove north on Highway 99.

Police said Friday they had located some of the stolen checks near the highway at Junction City. They asked that anyone finding any of the checks contact the Eugene department.

To determine the number of checks still missing, police requested persons who fished checks at the grocery last week-end to get in touch with the proprietor, Victor Allen Cone.

Truman Chase On Committee

Sen. Truman Chase of Eugene has been named to a seven-man interim committee to confirm any appointments that may be made by the governor to the State Board of Higher Education.

Also on the committee, to serve until the legislature's 1957 session, are Sens. Howard Belton, Canby; Eugene Allen, Portland; Philip Lowry, Medford; J. O. Johnson, Tigard; and Mark Hatfield, Salem.

The appointments were announced Thursday by Senate President Elmo Smith.

Appointments by the governor to boards and commissions must be ratified by the State Senate, which poses a problem as the Senate meets for less than four months each two years. The interim committees are a practical answer. However, their confirmations must be later reaffirmed by the Senate.

Heater, Not Pad, Said Fire Cause

Mrs. Ester Tobey, 206 W. 5th Ave., reported Friday that a Wednesday morning fire at her home was started by a portable electric heater which ignited heavy drapes in a room next to the kitchen.

The cause of the fire was originally described as an electric heating pad igniting newspapers near the bed of a dog which died of suffocation in the fire. Mrs. Tobey said Friday that there were no papers involved in the fire. She said the drapes which first caught fire were destroyed.

An estimated \$300 damage resulted from the fire. In addition to the dog, a pet canary was killed by suffocation. Mrs. Tobey suffered burns of the fingers when she attempted to remove the dog from the flame-filled room.

Quick action by the Eugene Fire Dept. confined the blaze to the room where it originated.
