Club Wants Ike to Attend Convention

PORTLAND (U.S.)—The Western Federation of American-Syrian-Lebanese Clubs will hold its centennial convention here July 1-4 and it has asked President Eisenhower to give a speech.

The meeting is in observance of the 100th anniversary of the first Syrian-Lebanese to come to this country.

Robert A. Bitar, local spokesman, said the appearance of the President would be "the greatest conciliatory move the U. S. has ever made in the direction of the troubled Arabic Middle East."

The President has been named "man of the centennial."

First Woman

PORTLAND (U.S.)—Louise Rodgers of Corvallis will become the first woman in the 90-year history of Concordia College here to receive a diploma when graduation exercises are held Friday.

Ten of her classmates and 13 high school seniors will also receive diplomas from the Rev. Thomas Coates, president of the college.

Henry Holgate Dies

PORTLAND (U.S.)—Henry L. Holgate, 88, retired chief counsel for the U. S. Reclamation Service, died Monday.

Holgate was born in Corvallis in 1887 and lived there for about 40 years. He graduated from Oregon Agricultural College, now Oregon State, in 1888.

Southeast Holgate Boulevard here was named after him.

2,148 Sign Register

SALEM (U.S.)—A total of 2,148 tourists signed the register in the Capitol during the day. Gene Vandendyke, guide, announced Tuesday.

There were 2,113 from 28 states and the District of Columbia and 35 from foreign countries.

The total included 1,812 from Oregon.
