without finding any trace of Hibbs. Hibbs' wife, who had been waiting at the Alder Springs camp since the search began Friday, collapsed Sunday afternoon and was taken to her daughter's home in Blue River, Eldorado said.

The bloodhounds, owned by Norman Wilson of Dallas, led the party to the new trail after spending the night following the scent from a rough camping spot discovered by searchers Sunday afternoon near Sims Butte.

Woodsmen said Hibbs had apparently slept Saturday night at the camp, located about five miles northeast of the lake. Snow had been trampled down and boughs gathered to form a bed.

They said his trail led to within 50 yards of the McKenzie Highway, which is still covered with snow in the area. Hibbs then veered back toward the southeast in the direction of nearby North Sister mountain.

The fresh trail was discovered Monday morning about four miles east of Linton Lake along Obsidian Creek. The search party, composed of about 35 men, was following the trail back toward the lake when the last report was issued by radio.

Snowdrifts up to four feet deep cover the ground in the mountainous section where the search moved Sunday afternoon. Previous searching had been centered around an area north of Linton Lake where Hibbs' sweater was discovered by the bloodhounds early Saturday.

An all-night search of the area by the bloodhounds ended Sunday morning with no fresh sign of the missing man. The dogs and their owner had abandoned the search before the sleeping place was discovered Sunday afternoon.

The dogs were rushed back to the camp-site and placed on the trail. After following the trail overnight, the searchers estimated the trail was only a few hours old at the point where they found the fresh footprints in the snow. Hibbs, a native of South Dakota, had been visiting his daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Dale Piper of Blue River. Piper called the U. S. Forest Service when the elderly man failed to return from Linton Lake Thursday night. The search for Hibbs began Friday morning.

A map of the trail covered by the bloodhounds indicated that he wandered north from the lake about half a mile to the point where he lost or discarded his sweater. Then he turned toward the northeast, following an uphill course to the point where his camping spot was found by searchers Sunday. From there, the trail led back toward the south.

Relatives said Hibbs had no food or water with him and was dressed in light clothing. Weather in the area had been mild until Sunday night, when temperatures dropped and fresh snow fell.

EVANGELIST ARRIVES

ZURICH, Switzerland (AP)—American evangelist Billy Graham arrived here Sunday night from Paris for two religious meetings to be held next weekend in Zurich and Geneva.

Anderson said the guaranteed wage plan was identical with the one the UAW "negotiated last week with another member of the auto industry."

Anderson told Reuther that "I hold no resentment toward your efforts to get those things for your members which you think they should have. That's your job. And I do want to congratulate you on your judgment in going somewhere else first (to Ford) to get it."

Anderson said he was "happy to report that many of the fine, progressive features of the first proposal we made to the UAW-CIO four weeks ago have been incorporated in this new agreement."

Among these he listed: Guaranteed pay raises of 6 to 8 cents an hour for all employees in each of the next three years. An extra raise of at least 6 cents an hour for skilled workers.

Pension plan improvements to boost maximum pensions to more than \$250 a month, including social security.

Elimination or reduction of wage inequities for 90,000 employees.

An extra half week vacation for employees with 10 years or more service.

One extra paid holiday a year.

Improvements in the hospital-medical-insurance plan.

Other portions of the original GM settlement proposal rejected by the UAW were not among the settlement terms. These included an opportunity for employees to buy company stock at half price, an interest-free loan plan for laid-off workers, and separation pay.

REUTHER HAPPY

Ford had also offered these stock-loan-separation pay provisions but met with a UAW rejection.

Reuther said the new agreement "without doubt compares favorably with the Ford agreement."

shop" has been in effect in GM plants. Under that arrangement, employees not belonging to the union when the agreement was signed were not forced to become union members, but new employees were required to join the union. Now all employees will be forced to join the union within 60 days to hold their jobs. Reuther said less than 5 per cent of hourly rated GM workers are presently non-union.

"MEDICAL UMPIRE"

Reuther said the union gained more improvements in the working agreement of the new contract than in all previous contracts since 1941 combined. These, he said, include faster and more effective hearings on grievances, more even distribution of overtime, and establishment of a "medical umpire" to rule on any questions over worker entitlement to sickness benefits.

Reuther said the company and union had been in agreement for some time on the guaranteed wage issue. He indicated this had not been an issue in the long weekend bargaining wrangle. The issue that snagged the contract talks well into this morning was over skilled workers' wages.

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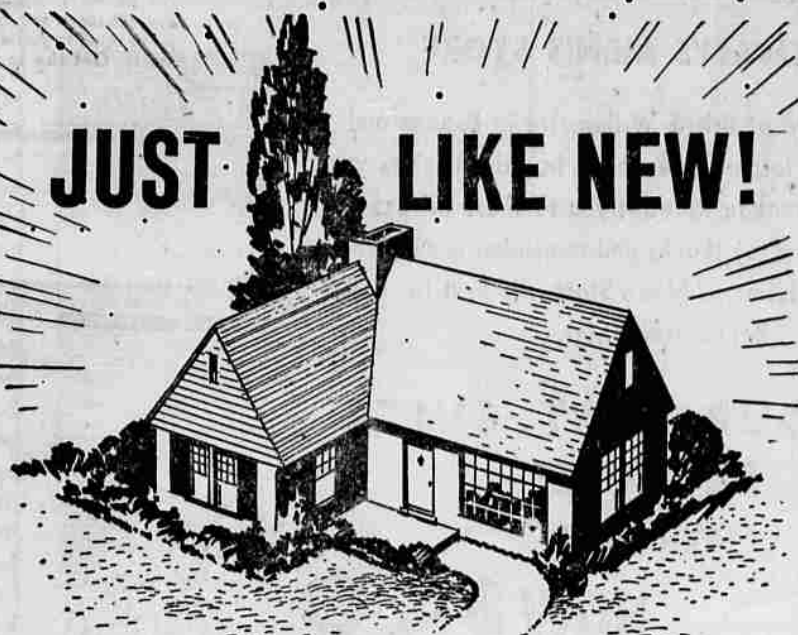
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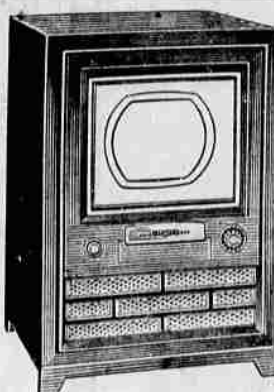

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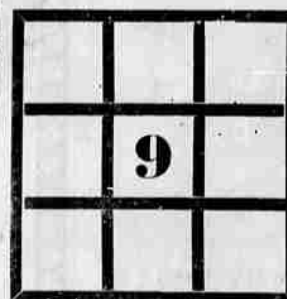
