Solons Recess Hearing, Issue Subpenas for 2 Alleged Reds

WASHINGTON (AP)—Senate investigators said Friday they have subpoenas out for two persons named as onetime Communists and newsmen and are looking for others in an inquiry into Red influences dating back to the late 1930s.

The Senate Internal Security subcommittee, in two days of public hearings, heard Charles Grutner, a New York Times reporter, and Winston M. Burdett, a CBS newsmen, acknowledge they were Communists some 15 or more years ago. The hearing then was recessed.

Grutner Thursday and Burdett on Wednesday testified they had joined the Communist party as reporters on the now-defunct Brooklyn Eagle in 1937 and had quit it before they went to work for their present employers—Grutner in 1949 and Burdett in 1942.

Grutner Thursday said he never heard of that. He testified that the story had been cleared by the Pentagon in Washington before it was published by the Times.

"You were not told the Air Force did not want the enemy to know we were using the F86 in Korea?" Eastland asked him.

"I was told nothing like that," Grutner said.

'NOT A FACT'
He challenged as "not a fact" a suggestion by Eastland that the disclosure had cost the United States a tactical advantage in Korea.

Turner Catledge, managing editor of the Times, said in a statement issued in New York: "The Times rejects any implication that national security was jeopardized by its publication of Charles Grutner's dispatch regarding the F86 Sabre Jet."

Catledge said Grutner had filed the story with a preceding note asking that it be cleared by the Pentagon. Catledge said a member of the Times Washington staff read the story to a civilian member of the Air Force's press section, and that this official said, "Go ahead and publish this story."

As for Grutner's accreditation as a correspondent, the Pentagon said its records show a recommendation for revocation was received Jan. 10, 1951, from Gen. Craigie, then vice commander of the Far East Air Force.

The Pentagon said the recommendation was relayed by the Army to Clayton Fritchey, then the Defense Department's director of public information.

It said Fritchey advised the Army Jan. 15, 1951, that the Defense Department did not concur in the recommendation.

HEARINGS RECESSED
Catledge said that by that time Grutner, who had previously asked a return to his regular assignment, had returned home. He is now a general assignment reporter.

Judge Clears John Service

WASHINGTON (AP)—A federal judge Thursday ordered wiped from the record a finding of "reasonable doubt," as the loyalty of John Stewart Service. The court said, however, that Service is not entitled to get back his job with the State Department.

U. S. Dist. Judge Edward M. Curran said an adverse finding by the Loyalty Review Board in the Service case "is a nullity."

He cited a recent ruling by the Supreme Court in the case of Dr. John P. Peters, senior professor of medicine at Yale University.

The Supreme Court said the Loyalty Review Board lacked authority to review on its own motion cases in which lower loyalty boards had ruled in favor of government employees.

Service, 46, was fired as a State Department foreign service officer by former Secretary of State Dean Acheson in December, 1951.

Acheson fired Service after the Loyalty Review Board held there was "reasonable doubt" as to his loyalty.

President Signs Draft Measure

WASHINGTON (AP)—Authority to draft young men 18½ to 26 for two years' active duty in the armed forces has been extended for four years.

President Eisenhower signed the selective service extension into law Thursday night a few hours before the old act expired at midnight.

The same act extends for two years the authority to draft doctors, dentists and veterinarians. The upper age limit was lowered from 51 years to 46.
