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Neuberger TV Bill 'A Matter of Ethics'

WASHINGTON — Richard Lewis Neuberger, a tall, balding writer who last November got himself elected the first Democratic Senator from Oregon in 40 years, is trying to make a point.

Military Men, Civilians Fight In Gang Style

WICHITA FALLS, Tex. — Sheppard Air Force Base ordered a 9 p.m. curfew for the 16,000 airmen and officers at the base after gang fights and near-fights broke out during the weekend between civilian teen-agers and military men.

It was not clear what the fighting was about.

ONE CASUALTY

Only one casualty has resulted — an airman was slashed and beaten at a city park a week ago. But the Wichita Falls Record News said no single incident set off the tension, which began building up about 10 days ago.

Authorities said they were tipped that both airmen and civilian teenagers began carrying weapons, including pistols, Sunday.

Col. Melvin S. Hollidge, deputy base commander, said the latest incident occurred Sunday night behind a baseball park and 50 airmen were "apprehended."

ANOTHER FIGHT

Authorities say they discovered that another gang fight was set for next Friday.

Last Friday, at least 200 airmen and civilians milled around at Bellevue Park until dispersed by every available police officer on duty. Police said the teenagers had gathered to "have a brawl" and airmen admitted they had come to fight.

The curfew caught city officials by surprise. They pledged cooperation with military authorities and said they hoped the curfew would be lifted soon.

atrical make-believe which professional actors enjoy.

"If we're going to reduce politics to the status of play-acting," he said, "then we're in serious trouble. It's a matter of ethics. Television is a great, compelling medium. I want it to be used honestly. I don't want our politics to become a professional Hippodrome."

Neuberger introduced legislation in support of his point a couple of months ago. His bill would require a politician to state when he is wearing make-up or using a teleprompter on television. Persons other than the Senator think it no more likely his bill will become law than snow will fall here in this hot July.

Neuberger, undismayed, continues trying to make a point that appeals to some observers:

"TV lends itself with equal facility to truth and to illusion. It will impartially show either unadorned fact or the most imaginative flights of fancy. Yet, because of its youth, TV's reputation for truth and veracity is still fairly good. This fact, I fear, gives it a potentially dangerous power in our public life."

DIM VIEW

Thus Neuberger takes a dim view of some activities of a National Republican Congressional Committee group. The group permits Congressmen to have their images dubbed into television films showing atomic installations and the like, he says. Or a Congressman is shown interviewing a high official he has not actually seen—thanks to film-splicing. Such films may then be shown, he says, as a nonpolitical public service feature by the Congressman's hometown TV station.

"My bill has been burlesqued because many people have a guilty feeling and don't want to face up to a very serious situation."
