10 Days Left For Jalopy Registration

Eugene youngsters have 10 more days until the deadline for signing up in the 1955 Jalopy Jamboree, sponsored by the Eugene Active Club.

Boys from 10 to 15 years old are eligible for the downhill race, which will be held Aug. 14 on the Washington Street hill. Entry applications must be postmarked not later than July 30.

644 Colombians Killed in Fighting

CALCUTTA, India (AP)—President Gustavo Rojas Pinilla says 644 Colombians were killed in one province alone during the past three months of his government's efforts to stamp out rebellious elements.

In a speech Wednesday night marking Colombia's Independence Day, Rojas Pinilla gave this breakdown of the dead: liberals 87; Conservatives 492; armed forces 65.

The President charged the insurgents are inspired by Communist elements and aided by dissident politicians and criminals.

Cotton Output High

NEW DELHI, India (AP)—India seems to be nearing Texas' class in the output of cotton. The Agriculture Ministry estimates Indian production in the 1955-56 fiscal year will total 4,298,000 bales, up almost 7 per cent over last year. Texans needn't worry yet though. Note those 4,350,000 bales they turned out in 1953. And American bales run 500 pounds, against 392 for India's.

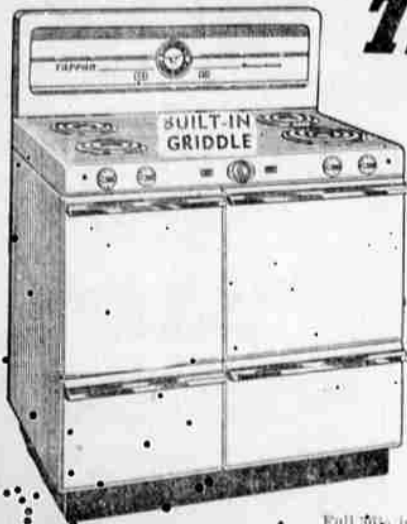
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
