INSIDE BASEBALL for Little Leaguers

BATTERS SHOULD LEARN TO SWING SO THAT THEY CAN RECOVER BALANCE QUICKLY IN HEADING FOR FIRST BASE WHEN THEY HIT THE BALL.



Base running begins in the batter's box when you hit the ball. How you start is as important as it is in sprint races at track meets. Everyone knows how often a base runner arrives at a base less than a stride behind the ball.

If a left-handed batter doesn't swing too hard, his body motion will be in the direction of first base as he completes his swing, and his first stride will be directly toward first base with his rear foot.

It is more difficult for right-handed hitters to get a good break from the plate if they are pulling the ball to left field. However, it is possible to do so by maintaining good body balance, and plenty of practice should be given to taking a full swing and follow through and still keeping the body from falling toward third base at the finish.
