He has been pastor of two Canadian congregations, as well as president of the Owen Sound District in Ontario. He served for three years as city pastor in Cleveland, and has done extensive missionary work in Canada, Michigan and Indiana. In his more recent ministry, his work has taken him to Hawaii.

John Noble to Speak At Lighthouse Temple

John Noble, one of the few Americans to return from a Russian slave labor camp, will speak about his experiences Monday at 7:30 p.m. at Lighthouse Temple, Eugene.

Noble will show a film, "The Vanished," also based on his experiences, before the talk.

He will also speak Sunday at the 11 a.m. worship service at First Baptist Church, Broadway and High Street, Eugene.

Noble was born in Detroit, Mich. in 1923 and attended school there until 1938. At that time he accompanied his parents to Germany to study in one of his father's photo industry factories while his father was receiving medical treatment.

When World War II broke out the Noble family was put under local internment until 1945 by Hitler's forces. As the Soviet Red Army occupied East Germany, the Nobles expected to be liberated, since they were United States citizens, but instead were imprisoned by the Soviets. Later

Drive Begins For Camp

Expansion of Camp Lutherwood west of Eugene is the hope of Lutheran leaders of the community if a fund campaign now underway is successful.

The camp is located on Highway 36, about 25 miles west of Eugene. It contains 33 acres to be developed for various activities for use by all Lutherans.

Officials of Lutheran Laymen, the group of Lane County men who administer the grounds, said this week that plans call for construction this summer of a swimming pool and camp shelters, if funds are available. The campaign is getting underway Sunday.

One of the first features of previous programs is the construction of a 100 by 40-foot dining hall and kitchen. Most of the material for the building had been donated. The Vik Construction Co. of Eugene has done much of the work with volunteer labor helping.

Young people from Lutheran churches of the area are expected to use the grounds for the first time as a summer camp this year.
