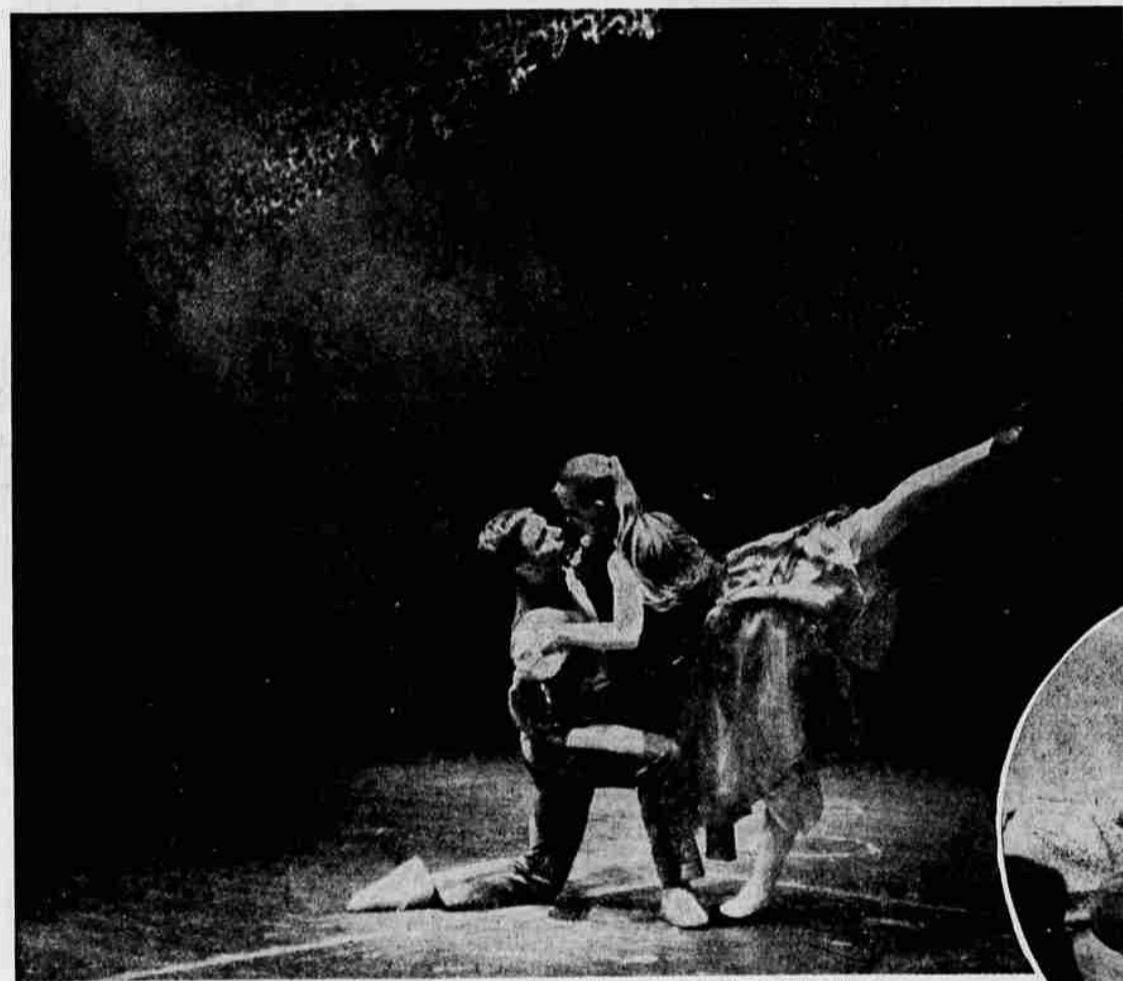

A cast of more than 250 students, under the direction of Ed Ragazzino, has been in rehearsal for many weeks on the show adapted from Molnar's play, "Lilliom." Dave Sherman is technical director and Weston Brockway is musical director for the production for which six thousand tickets have been sold.
