Hostesses will be Mrs. Elton Nielsen from Bethesda Lutheran Church and Mrs. Paul Hanson from Central Lutheran.

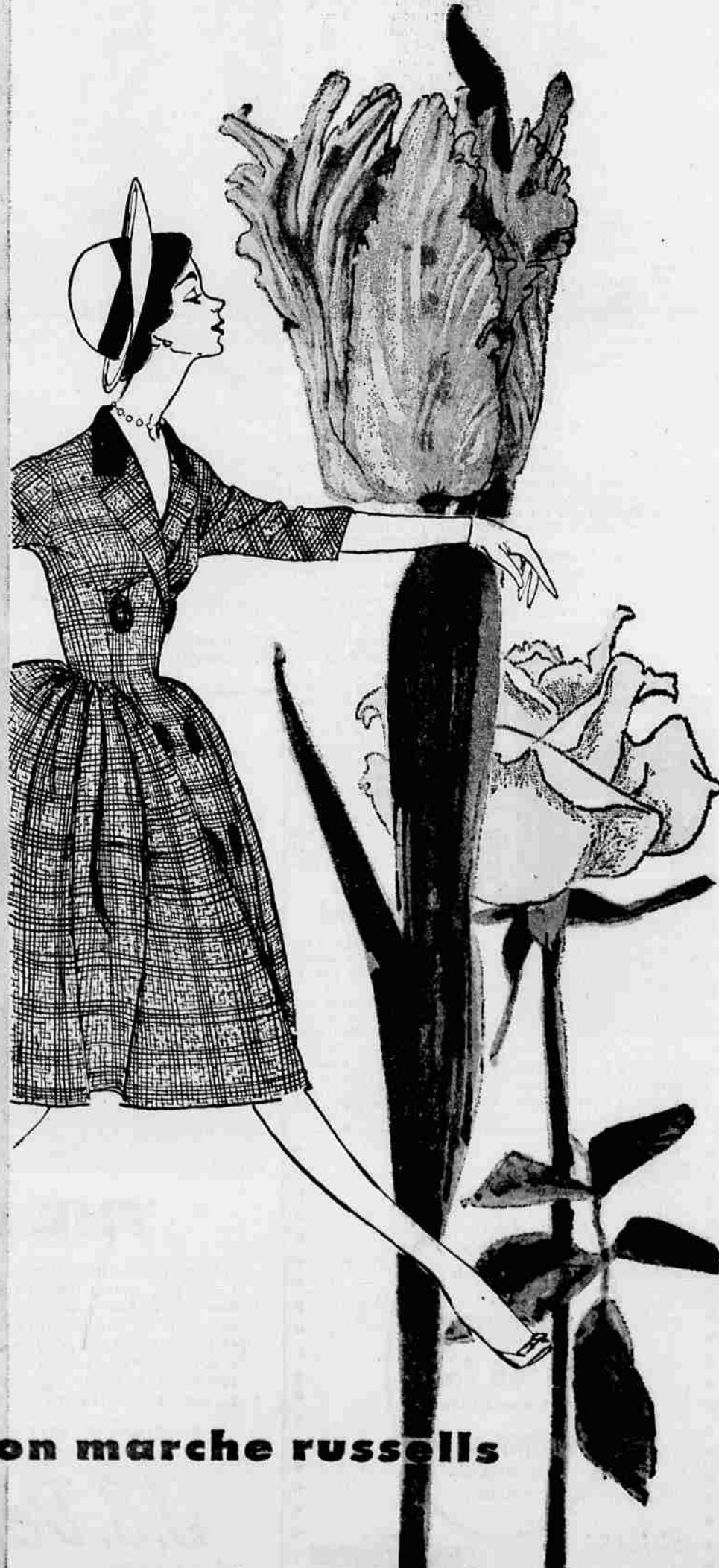
