\$790 Million Cut From Foreign Aid Bill

WASHINGTON (AP)—The House Appropriations Committee Monday cut 790½ million dollars from President Eisenhower's original foreign aid requests, including 400 million from military assistance.

If the action is sustained by the House later this week, the aid program would get \$3,384,500,000 of the \$4,175,000,000 Eisenhower requested for the fiscal year starting July 1. In addition, it would have available an estimated 400 million in previous funds which have not been obligated in spending.

EARLIER LIMITATION

While the President actually requested \$4,175,000,000 in new money, Congress limited appropriations to \$4,086,300,000 in a separate bill authorizing continuance of the aid program. The actual money figure is \$701,800,000 below the authorized amount.

The cuts were approved despite a special Eisenhower plea Saturday that the committee reject the proposed reductions in military assistance and defense support funds.

regularly has been more generous than the House in foreign aid funds, will be asked to restore some of the cuts.

The committee's action was taken on recommendation of a subcommittee headed by Rep. Otto E. Passman (D-La.).

The military phase of the program, which finances fighting equipment, training, supplies and services for friendly nations, was limited by the committee to \$1,600,000,000 of the two billion requested.

RESERVES CITED

The committee offered no explanation for the cut, but noted that the amount approved is 300 million more than was appropriated for the present year and said more than two billion in unexpended balances was available.

Here's what the committee recommended for other phases of the program:

- Defense support, economic aid to bolster defense programs: The President requested 724 million; Congress limited this to 675

million in the authorization, and the committee pared it to 600 million.

- Technical Cooperation, a program designed to develop economic resources and productive capacities of underdeveloped areas. The President wanted 172 million dollars, which Congress authorized. The committee cut it to 150 million.

- United Nations program for technical help: The committee approved the entire 33 million dollars requested.

- Special assistance program:

The President requested 268½ million dollars. Congress limited this to 256 million and the committee cut it to 206 million.

- President's special emergency fund (to meet unforeseen contingencies). The President asked for 175 million dollars. Congress authorized only 150 million and the committee approved that figure.

- Development loan fund: The President asked for 700 million dollars. The committee cut this to 550 million, the amount authorized by Congress.

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Constitution Drawn Up For Turkey

ANKARA, Turkey (AP)—A committee of 38 military leaders who overthrew strongman Pre-up a provisional constitution giving it supreme power in Turkey.

Gen. Cemal Gursel and his military associates said they would remain in authority until a new National Assembly can be elected. No election date was mentioned.

Gursel is now provisional president and premier.

The constitution promised a show trial of Menderes, former President Celal Bayar and other leaders of the ousted government. It said an investigation committee has been named to determine their responsibility "for crimes which may have been committed against the state."

It also provided for a "high justice court" to try Menderes, Bayar, former government members and former members of the Assembly. It said the court would be made up of a president, eight active and six "reserve" members, to be selected by the ruling junta from civil and military judges proposed by the present Cabinet.

"Sentences handed down by the high court of justice cannot be appealed," the constitution said "only execution of death sentences is subject to confirmation of the national unity committee."

France Says Red Plan Won't Split Allied Front

GENEVA (AP)—France warned the Soviet Union Monday it would be a serious error to believe the new Soviet disarmament plan, partly based on French ideas, could disrupt the solidarity of the Western Alliance.

French disarmament expert Jules Moch told the 10-nation disarmament conference the plan put forward by Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev June 2 "denotes a complete change in the Soviet position, even if certain principles seem to have remained unchanged."

Moch recalled that Khrushchev and Soviet Delegate Valerian Zorin repeatedly emphasized that the plan contained proposals originally put forward by the French government.

"If—as I do not believe—the authors of the plan conceived it with the ulterior motive of exploiting it in order to weaken or disrupt the Western Alliance, they will have made a serious error, as nothing will shake our solidarity," Moch said.

In his first speech since the disarmament talks resumed June 7, Moch said the Soviet plan had obviously been drafted for presentation at the ill-fated summit conference.

Ormsby-Gore asked Zorin a series of questions, saying the answers were essential to permit the Western powers to determine their attitude to the Soviet plan.

Zorin replied that the questions should be settled by negotiation, and suggested that the Western delegations start the ball rolling by proposing their own answers.

Maneuvers to Begin

SEOUL, Korea (AP)—Amphibious maneuvers will start Tuesday for 17,000 U.S. and South Korean sailors and Marines. A U.S. 7th Fleet spokesman said Exercise Sea Hawk will take place from June 14-19 on beaches near Pohang, 80 miles north of Pusan. Sixty-two ships, 32 of them Korean, will take part.

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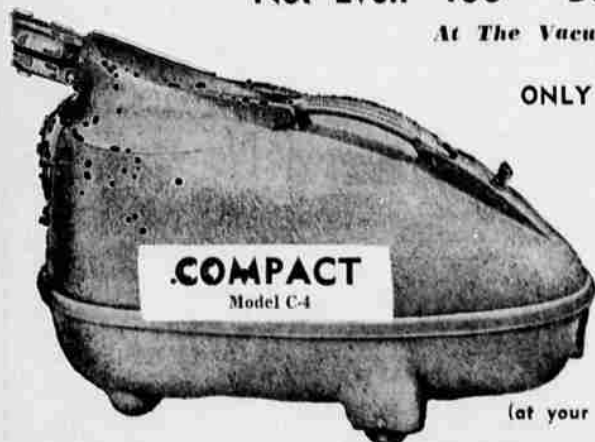
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
