25 Prisoners Attend Annual Music Festival

SAN QUENTIN, Calif. — A convict sat in the sun Sunday holding hands with his girl friend.

Another inmate was nearby, his arms wrapped around his four children.

Twenty-five selected prisoners mingled with their visitors in the parking lot across the lawn from the gas chamber during San Quentin's sixth annual music festival. They sat among an audience of about 150.

"This is an experiment," said the associate warden, Walter Achuff. "We hope it works out all right."

It did. A young inmate in a starched blue denim shirt stepped to the microphone and announced apologetically: "Our regular matter of ceremonies is missing."

A titter swept the audience. A guard raised his eyebrows. The regular Emcee, it developed, had misplaced his identity card and so hadn't been allowed outside his main cell block.

The highlight of the festival was the 18-piece inmate band's performance of two compositions by their leader, trumpeter Charlie Caudle. The band played Caudle's "Blues of Infinitum" and "Laughin' and Scratchin'."

Caudle will be eligible for parole soon. He was convicted of burglary and narcotics violation.

At the end of the program, the master of ceremonies returned to the microphone and quietly said: "We want to thank an enlightened administration for encouraging this kind of activity."

Bootes and located it roughly. Recently, a new radio telescope at Cambridge, and Caltech's twin, 90-foot steerable dishes were able to pinpoint the source more accurately. This enabled Minkowski to make a two-hour exposure of the radio signal source. It appears on the plate as a blurred dot.

Even more significant from a scientific standpoint, the news release said, is the fact he was able to photograph a spectrum of the object. The spectrum photographs required 4½ and 9 hours of exposure, during which time the 200-inch telescope tracked the object across the sky.

These photographs disclosed that the spectrum had shifted much farther into the red than anything heretofore obtained. The amount of shift means the object is receding at a velocity of 46 per cent the speed of light, Minkowski reported.

The astronomer has been searching for an extremely distant object, such as the one just identified, to help determine which of several cosmological theories is correct.

One of the current major theories is the steady state theory which says that matter is being generated continually throughout the universe. The other major theory holds that the universe began with a titanic explosion. The latter theory has several variations.

Now attempts will be made to establish whether the new radio object is associated with the cluster of galaxies in its apparent vicinity. If this can be determined, then the average luminosity of the galaxies in the cluster will be obtained.

This apparent average luminosity and recession velocity of the radio source are the keys that are expected to be of tremendous value in re-evaluating cosmological theory, according to the Caltech announcement.

Directors Due To Study Bids

Springfield's school district directors will consider a number of bids on major items, a drainage project at Thurston High School and the summer school program at 8 p.m. Monday.

Among the bids to be opened are those for language laboratories, custodial supplies and equipment, general school supplies, gasoline, fuel and fuel oil.

The board also may take final action on a proposal to change a drainage project at Thurston High School, the district's second senior high which is under construction.

A progress report on the tuition-free summer school program also will be presented.

Summer maintenance and construction plans for the district will be outlined during the meeting, which will be held at the school administration building, Tenth and G streets.

Ben-Gurion Wants Help From French

PARIS — Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion of Israel arrived Monday for talks with President Charles de Gaulle which could include an appeal for French support in the Eichmann affair.

The Israeli Prime Minister also may try to set up a meeting here with President Arturo Frondizi of Argentina on the same matter. Frondizi is due later.

Ben-Gurion will see De Gaulle Tuesday. His official stay ends Tuesday evening but he will stay on privately until June 20.

Officially, France has taken no stand on the seizure in Argentina of Adolf Eichmann, director of the Nazi "final solution" which resulted in extermination of millions of Jews. But the French are known to be sympathetic to the Israelis and De Gaulle might be prepared to do his best to soothe feelings at least.

Ben-Gurion departed after a Cabinet meeting which reportedly reaffirmed that Eichmann would remain in Israel to stand trial for his part in the Nazi extermination of Jews. Argentina had demanded that he be returned to Buenos Aires and that the Jewish undercover agents who spirited him out of Argentina late in May be punished. Argentina threatened to take the case to the United Nations unless Eichmann were returned.

Small Revolt Fails In Western Argentina

BUENOS AIRES — President Arturo Frondizi's government announced Monday that a vest-pocket revolt in western Argentina had collapsed a scant six hours or so after it started.

Frondizi told newsmen the bulk of Argentina's armed forces had rallied to his side within a few hours after the small-scale rebellion Sunday night in San Luis.

The President confidently announced he would leave as planned this afternoon on a month-long tour of Europe.

Before dawn a spokesman for the Interior Ministry said loyal troops had captured Gen. Mauricio Gomez, commander of the 2nd Argentina Army, who reportedly joined the rebels.

The other rebels fled from the strategic sites they captured a few hours earlier in San Luis, including the local radio station, the spokesman said.

Gen. Rodolfo Larcher, the secretary of war, had warned the rebels to surrender by dawn or to face an assault by loyal troops from the surrounding area. He said the rebel force numbered only 300 to 400 men of an anti-aircraft group.

Gen. Larcher said the military rebels would be tried in military courts, and the civilians brought to trial under the "Conintes" plan adopted last March. This gives military courts the right to try

civilians and impose the death penalty for such actions as sabotage and bombings.

Most of the leading rebels were members of what Argentines have nicknamed the "Gorilla" group of officers. They are fervent anti-Peronists who denounced Frondizi for wooing votes from supporters of former dictator Juan D. Peron in the 1958 elections.

Fortunato Giovannoni, a retired general who served some time in jail during Peron's regime, proclaimed himself provisional president of the rebel government.

The rebels accused the Frondizi government of "Marxist, Trotskyist and Communist tendencies."

In a broadcast from San Luis, in the foothills of the Andes 400 miles northwest of Buenos Aires, the rebels declared: "We want a free nation without Peronists and Communists."

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
