Worst on TV

Poll Puts Jackie Two Under Paar

NEW YORK (UPI) — It's just an idle boast when Jackie Gleason calls "You're in the Picture," his abortive one-shot panel show, TV's worst program.

Results of my recent one-shot post card contest to find out how the viewers feel about the worst that TV has had to offer show Gleason's program to be merely third worst. Jack Paar, no less, finished in first place. "The Price is Right" came in second. Behind Gleason, tied for fourth place, were "What's My Line" and "This is Your Life," and "Dobie Gillis" came in fifth.

The views of the readers was inspired by Gleason's Jan. 27 half hour talkathon, wherein he tried to claim credit for putting on the champion of all flops. While I agree that his panel show was really dreadful, I also feel that had Gleason tried a little harder, he could have improved it to a point where it became a truly unbearable champion.

LOYAL READERS

I therefore asked loyal readers to complete the following: "Jackie Gleason is all wet because the all-time, bottom quality, worst TV show in history is still..." and I promised prizes for "The most entertaining replies." The judging is over now and I must say it was a nice little contest to judge because the cards were notably well-written and generally non-hysterical in tone. You should see some of the unsolicited mail.

As for the range covered by the contestants, you name the show and it's probably on the list. There was even a vote for the electronic computer that NBC-TV used in its election coverage. Jokes abound. One sample: "Candid Camera — I no Leica." But here are the ones I enjoyed the most:

"... 'This is Your Life,' a maudlin, superfluous parade of memories and attributes occasionally punctuated with people the victim has probably been avoiding for years." Mrs. Saul Baum, Galveston, Tex.

"... 'Rivak, the Barbarian,' a sort of Fred Flintstone out of Zorro by Marquis de Sade, a commercial triumph for the manufacturers of men's grooming aids." M. F. Spence, Jacksonville, Fla.

Television, Radio Highlights

Problems Facing Africa Object of NBC Special

"Africa: Five Minutes to Twelve," will be shown tonight on Channels 13 and 8 at 10. This special attempts a study of the basic problems facing Africa and, therefore, the world today. Via films and reports by NBC correspondents here and abroad, it tries to define the differences between the nature of the problems as they exist in North Africa, South Africa, the Congo, the still colonized area, and the independent states. Also, for an answer to the question: "Can the U.N. solve the African problem?" ambassador Adlai Stevenson is asked to participate.

Other Tuesday TV highlights: 7 p.m. Family Castle (7)—Earl Saari discusses Federal income tax deductions and points out some deductions you may have overlooked. This show might save you money. 7 p.m., Expedition (12)—"The Long Winter." There have been lots of documentaries about trips to the South Pole, but this one, with a harm all its own, probably is the most entertaining. Credit belongs primarily to narrator-scientist Edward R. Rymington, who has given it a home movie quality plus a very enthusiastic and pleasing narration. It is unburdened by scientific facts and can be fun for the whole family. 8 p.m., Rifleman (9-12) Marshal Mica goes back to the bottle. He's afraid of a certain gunslinger and is tired of having Lucas fight his battles for him. If you've been watching the series through the years, you'll appreciate the character relationship on which the plot is based. Incidentally, it looks as if Rex Ingram has been added as a regular. 8:30 p.m., Alfred Hitchcock (13-8) Patricia Collinge does a superb job as a solicitous landlady in this eerie tale. Dean Stockwell plays her new roomer who doesn't realize how permanent his arrangement is likely to be. Tip: ignore the opening; it's completely misleading. 9 p.m., Tom Ewell (6)—Tom can really give out with the sales talk, and he is aided here by a promising young actor, Jonathan Bolt. Story has real-estate lover Potter giving his trade the big

pitch to a Dodger baseball player who wants to give up the game. 10 p.m., Garry Moore (6)—Peter Lawford takes over for vacationing Garry tonight, and manages to hold the fort despite Durward Kirby. Lawford has lovely Sally Ann Howes on for a song, Jonathan Winters in a routine, Carol Burnett for her usual kick, and that wonderful year 1932 with its hits and colorful news.

11:10 p.m., Movie (6)—"Hit the Ice." Abbott and Costello. Sidewalk photographers are mistaken for bank robbers, catch up with the real crooks in Sun Valley. One of the funny A & C comedies; plenty of laughs, fast action (1943)—Good. 11:15 p.m., Movie (12)—"The Stock Club." Barry Fitzgerald, Betty Hutton. Hat check girl befriends penniless bum who is, naturally, a billionaire. Silly fable is saved by some nice performances. (1948)—Fair.

Titan Missile Hits Target

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP)—The Air Force has moved its Titan intercontinental range missile a step closer to operational readiness with a second straight successful 5,000-mile test flight.

The 98-foot missile smacked a target in the South Atlantic Monday night after a 30-minute 17,000-mile-an-hour flight. Officials reported it achieved all test objectives.

The missile carried nearly all components which will be on the final combat-ready design. The Air Force timetable calls for Titan to be operational in mid-summer.
