

Dental Society Elects Officers for '61-62

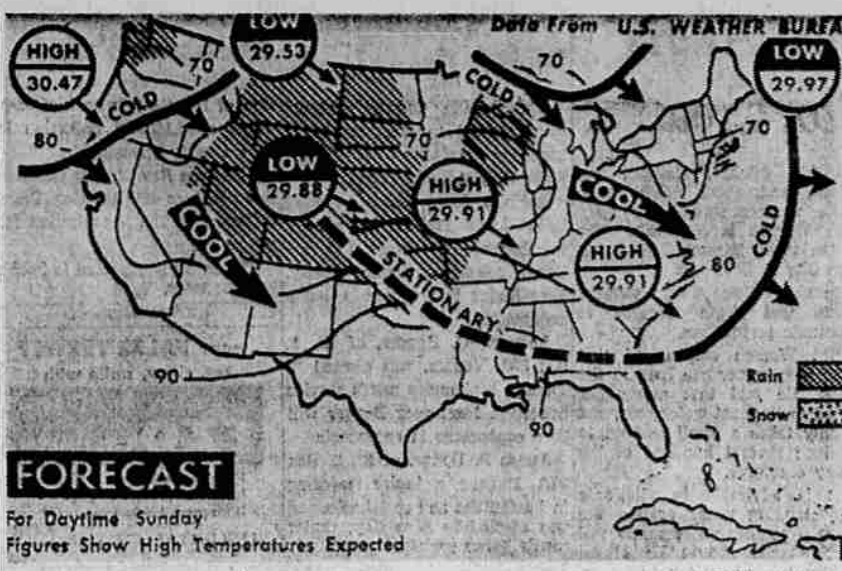
Dr. L. E. Epplett of Eugene and Dr. Dean I. Webb of Cottage Grove have been chosen to head the Lane County District Dental Society during 1961-62.

In elections last week, Epplett was advanced from the president-elect's post which he held during 1960-61. Webb will succeed Epplett as president in 1962-63.

Other officers who will head up the 96-member society are Dr. Martin Kolstoe, vice president; Dr. Robert Stansbury, secretary-treasurer; and Dr. Robert Glass, all of Eugene, editor of the society's monthly bulletin.

Dr. Epplett, 45, is a native of Portland and a 1950 graduate of Oregon State College. He graduated from the University of Oregon dental school in 1950, and has been in practice in Eugene since 1953. He served with the Army during World War II and with the Air Force during the Korean War. He is a major in the Air Force Reserve, a member of the Eugene Lions Club and of the Chamber of Commerce armed services committee.

Dr. Dean Webb, 36, a native of St. George, Utah, graduated in 1948 from the University of Southern California dental school after taking pre-dental work at Southern Utah. He served two years as a captain in the Army and is a member of Rotary, Elks and the Chamber of Commerce.

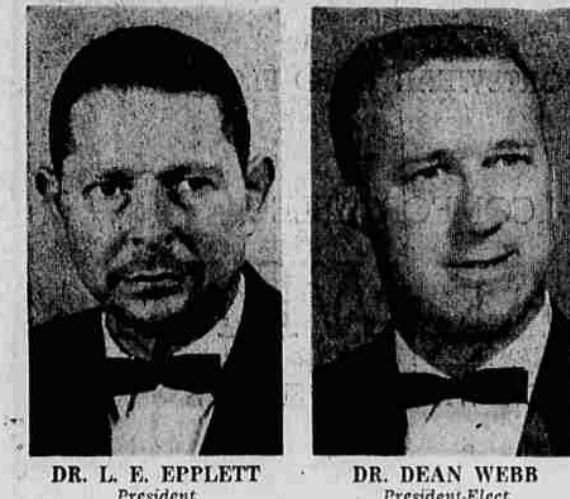

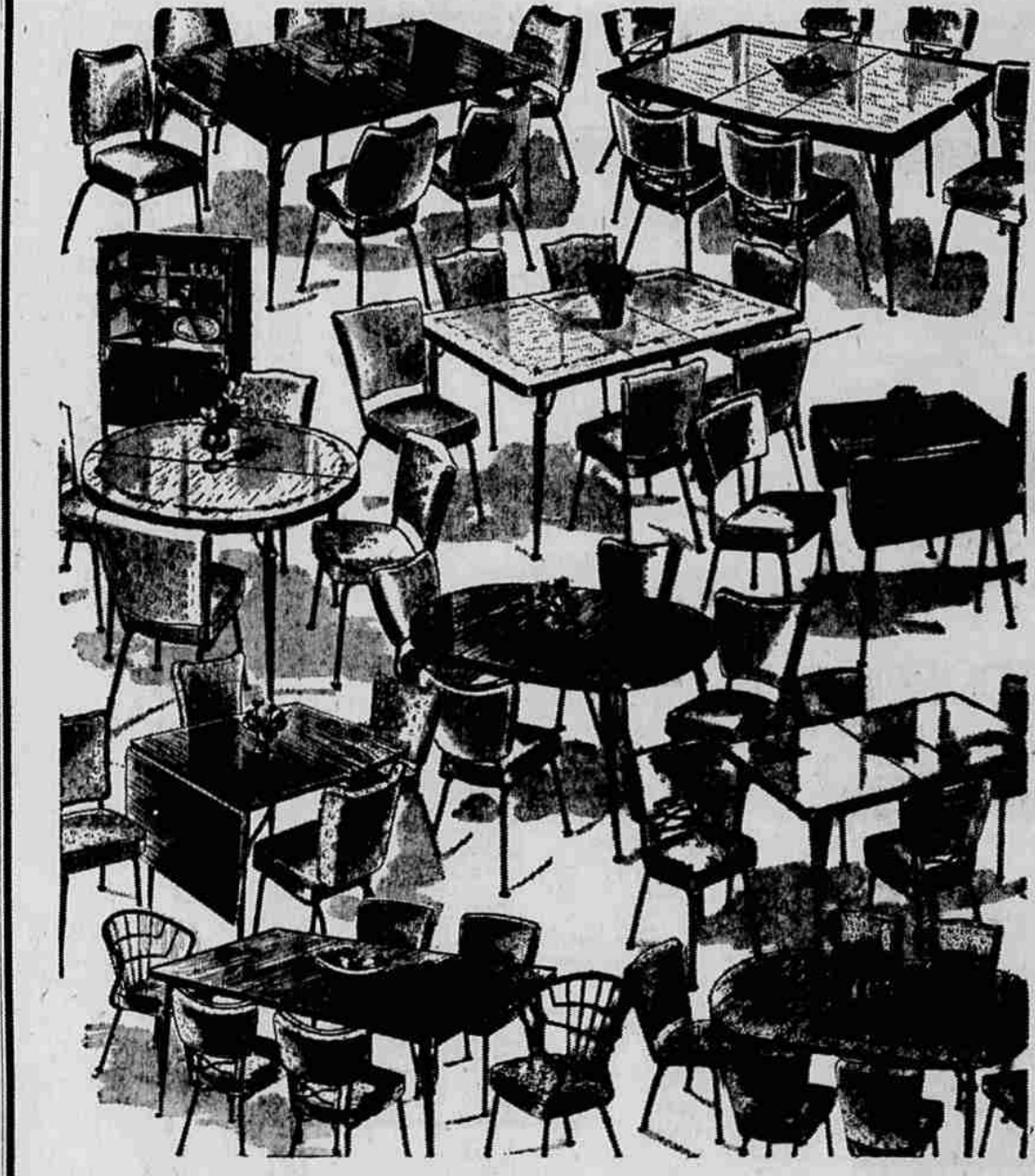
