'Exodus' Tells Story of Jews Going 'Home'

The violent beginnings of modern-day Israel are portrayed in the film adaptation of Leon Uris' novel, "Exodus," opening Wednesday at the Fox Theatre.

Opening scenes in the movie are set in Cyprus, where a large number of European Jews, who hope to reach Palestine, are interned by the British. Israel has not yet been partitioned, and there has been no decision made on what to do with the many refugees without a country.

In order to draw attention to the plight of these refugees, a young man—played by Paul Newman—organizes the escape of a freighter-load of refugees.

The plight of these refugees, their fate, the romances that develop and the building of a new homeland are featured throughout the movie.

Three different programs are scheduled for the Heilig Theatre this week. "Pepe," with Cantinflas in the featured role and 35 top motion picture stars in variety spots, will close Sunday.

On stage Monday will be a ballet program, "Concert for Sherri," and a much-lauded movie from past seasons, "Song Without End," starring Dirk Bogarde. He is the English star who recently has begun to rise in American popularity polls.
