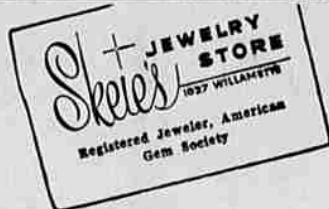
Dear Helen:

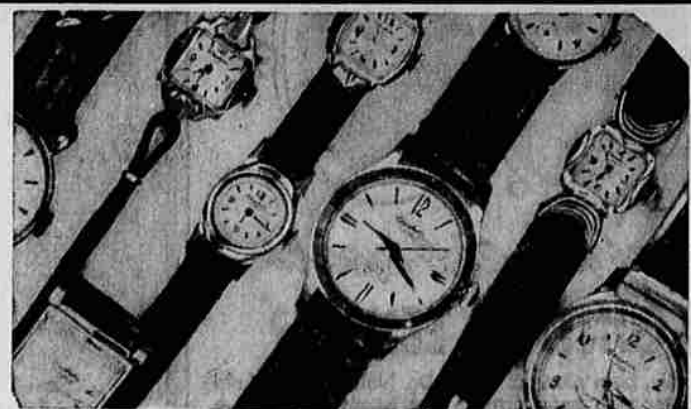

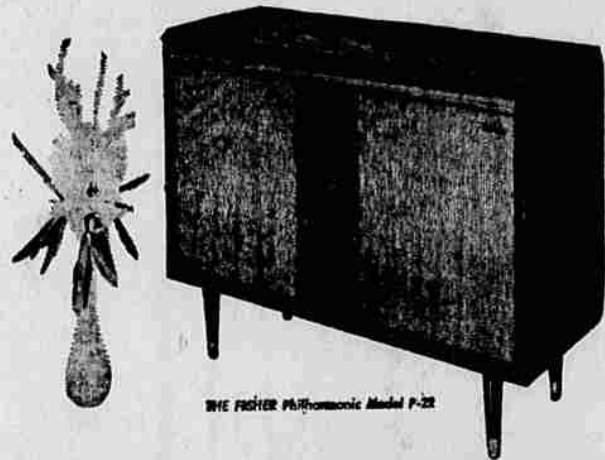
