

JFK, Khrushchev Exchange Polite New Year's Messages

PALM BEACH, Fla. (UPI)—President Kennedy had at least one thing in common with Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev this New Year's Day. Both seemed to wonder whether the world would move closer to peace or war in 1962.

The leaders of the world's major powers exchanged polite New Year's messages as Kennedy and his family spent a quiet holiday at their winter vacation residence here.

The only announced festivity in the President's New Year's Eve was a dinner dance Sunday night at the home of Charles B. Wrightman, former oil company executive and a world renowned art collector. The Wrightman place on the ocean is near the estate of C. Michael Paul who has made his winter

Rites for Dr. Lloyd L. Baker To Be Conducted Thursday

Funeral services for Dr. Lloyd L. Baker, 77, a Eugene dentist since 1911, has been scheduled for 2 p.m., Thursday, at the Simon-Lounsbury Mortuary.

Doctor Baker, had continued practicing dentistry until his death Saturday night at his home. He was the last living charter member of the Lane County Dental Society.

Doctor Baker died only a few hours after attending the wedding of his granddaughter, the former Joan Ruth Wasterlain, to Eugene attorney Gordon Wylie.

Doctor Baker was born Dec. 9, 1886 in Iowa. He was a graduate of Northwestern University dental school, where he served one year as a teacher after graduation.

He is survived by his wife, Eva V. Baker, whom he married on June 25, 1913 in Silverton, Ore. They have resided at 1209 Pearl St., Eugene, where Doctor Baker had his offices for 39 years.

Also surviving are two daughters and a son, Mrs. Edward Wasterlain of La Jolla, Calif.; Mrs. James T. Wetzel of Uruguay, Dale Lewis Baker of Eugene; a sister and a brother, Mrs. Pearl Elliott of Eugene, and Walter G. Baker of Salem, four grandchildren and five nephews and nieces.

Interment will be in the IOOF Cemetery, Eugene.

The U.S.-Russian messages were announced Sunday, along with a Kennedy New Year's greeting to members of the U.S. armed forces on duty overseas. Kennedy and Khrushchev each conceded troubles of the past and hoped for better relations in the future, and each in his own way.

Khrushchev spoke of "new hope" that 1962 would be a threshold from which there would be "steps in the cause of liquidation of centers of military danger."

"There is no doubt that on the state of affairs in Soviet-American relations depends very much whether humanity will go towards peace or war," said the Russian message which was signed by Khrushchev and L. Brezhnev, president of the Su-

prema Soviet Presidium. "At the meeting in Vienna the President of the United States and chairman of ministers of the U.S.S.R. agreed that history imposed a great responsibility on our peoples for the destinies of the world."

"The Soviet people regard the future optimistically. They express hopes that in the coming year our countries will be able to find ways toward closer cooperation, will be able to find a basis for concerted actions and efforts for the good of all humanity."

Khrushchev concluded with a pledge, "there will be no lack of resolution to do everything in its USSR power in order to ensure durable and lasting peace on our planet."

Kennedy, after a preamble of seasonal wishes, said: "The year which is ending has been a troubled one. It is my earnest hope that the coming year will strengthen the foundations of world peace and will bring an improvement in the relations between our countries, upon which so much depends. It is our grave responsibility to fulfill that hope. As President of the United States, I can state on behalf of the government and the American people that we will do our best to do so."
