Weekly Newspaper Income Shown in Cost Study Article

The average weekly newspaper in this country should have had a total income per subscriber of \$33.51 during 1960.

This is the figure, according to the National Weekly Newspaper Cost Study of the National Editorial Assn. and the Newspaper Assn. Managers, that would have been reached if the weekly newspaper had an "average" operation.

A report of the study appears in the National Publisher for January. It was written by Carl C. Webb, associate professor of journalism at the University of Oregon. Webb, who is chairman of the Cost Studies committee for both sponsoring associations, is secretary of the Oregon Newspaper Publishers Association.

The "average" income of such a weekly includes the total from advertising, circulation, commercial printing, and miscellaneous.

Out of this income, the average paper paid 18.1 per cent for office salaries (not including the publisher's), 27.5 per cent for shop wages, 15.5 per cent for materials, and 27.0 per cent for other expenses. This left 11.9 per cent net income before income taxes and the publisher's salary or drawings.

The study is based on the average of "perfect reports" from newspapers of the country, with perfect report meaning one on which a figure was supplied for each income and expense classification on the reporting form.

The study covers the period 1952-60. Figures show that 1957 was the best year for total income, with the average paper having a per subscriber income of \$36.80. However, the net income, 13.2 per cent in 1957, was sixth from highest. The highest net income of 15.8 per cent was in 1956, when total income per subscriber was \$33.41.
