

Prelude to New Party Purge?

Red China's Communists Castigated

TOKYO — Red China's leadership Thursday castigated members of the Chinese Communist Party who it said have become bureaucratic, insolent and self-satisfied.

The unusually sharp denunciation may be the prelude to a new purge of the Chinese party of more than 12 million members. The purged may become whipping boys for the present chaotic condition of Chinese agriculture, which has created hunger and unrest on the mainland.

The attack was published in the official Peiping People's Daily midway through an ultra-secret meeting of the National People's Congress, the Chinese Communists' rubber-stamp parliament.

"There are persons," the

paper said, "who have become steeped in bureaucracy, exhibit feelings of insolence and a self-satisfaction, forget realities, estrange themselves from the masses and do not care to discuss things with the masses."

The paper said that party members today exercise leadership during a period of great gravity and thus have heavier duties than in the past.

The editorial said many new members of the party lack experience in revolutionary struggle and have not been educated in Marxism and Leninism. Both old and new party members must, during the present period, undergo re-education, it continued.

"It has become an important task for us to understand the importance of solidifying the party's political, ideological and organization phases, strength-

ening the party's ideological construction," it declared.

The last big overhaul of the Chinese Communist Party took place in 1958 following the failure of Mao Tze-tung's freedom of expression policy, called "let all flowers bloom, let 100 schools of thought contend." For one startling month critics of Communism, and of Mao, had their public say. Then they were subjected to ruthless persecution as "rightists."

In recent months the Chinese Reds have made plain that the "great leap forward"—the crash program to make China a world

industrial power — has been shelved because of agriculture failures. Mao's agricultural program of rural communes, grouping millions of peasants into communized colonies, has been drastically modified because the peasants didn't produce in the communes.

As it did in the "let all flowers bloom" period, the People's Daily now says that party members should be encouraged to criticize higher ranking members.

"Say anything you know," the editorial said, "express whatever you are thinking, and if there is nothing wrong in a person's opinion, it should be taken as a lesson to the listener."

This time the flowers may not bloom so freely. Such criticism got many of the critics into deep trouble before.

Hungary Marks Anniversary

BUDAPEST, Hungary — Communist Hungary commemorated its World War II liberation by the Soviet Army with a giant military parade in Budapest Wednesday displaying latest Russian-made jets and rockets.

The parade, watched by Premier Janos Kadar, the entire cabinet and 100,000 spectators, included modern medium and heavy tanks, 12 ground-to-air rockets and supersonic fighters.

Defense Minister Lajos Czinege said in a speech the Communist countries had coordinated their defense plans and were keeping military efficiency at the highest level.

Soviets Ease Buzz Flights

BERLIN — The Soviets have flown no harassment flights in the air corridors to West Berlin for a week, raising cautious speculation that Moscow for the time being has called off its campaign of irritation on the West's access routes to the city.

The Russians last scheduled flights through the corridors on March 30. They then advised the Berlin Air Safety Center they would send eight transports on night flights at times when Western commercial aircraft were using the corridors.

These flights were canceled and none has been scheduled since.

Patrolling Soviet MIG fighters have been spotted by crews and passengers of Western airliners, but that is not unusual.

Change in Space Training Ordered by Red Scientists

MOSCOW — Soviet scientists have ordered changes in space training to counter irritations from weightlessness experienced by Gherman Titov, the trade union paper Trud reported Thursday.

The changes, the paper said, are mainly directed toward increasing the stability of the vestibular apparatus, the nerve system in the ear which gives the sense of balance and direction.

Trud said its correspondents visited a space research institute and were told the flights by Titov and Yuri Gagarin had confirmed the general correctness of the Soviet system of choosing and training space-men.

The account recalled that during his flight, Titov suffered from some vegetative derangement which were apparently due to unusual irritation of the organ of the space sense.

Vegetative derangement in this context normally would mean interference with nutritive processes. Titov after his flight said he was seasick.

The report noted that the American astronaut John H. Glenn Jr. said he had felt no unpleasant effects from weightlessness. "But it should be borne in mind that he circled the earth only three times while the phenomena mentioned by Titov were observed after protracted weightlessness," Trud added.

As a result of Titov's experience, it said, student astronauts will loop-the-loop repeatedly and get special exercises on springboards.

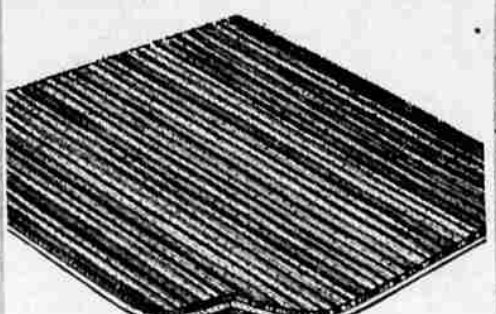

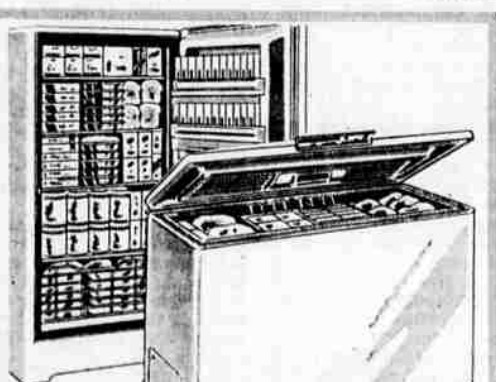

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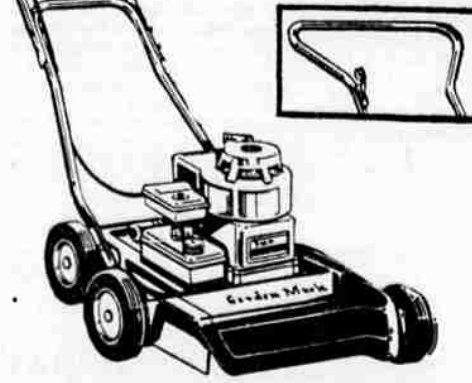
