

Evangelism Tour

Group Plans 'Mission to Mexico'

A student at Bible Standard College in Eugene has announced plans for an ambitious summer evangelism program in Mexico. Six other BSC students will participate, he said, and one other young man has joined their group.

The group—headed by the Rev. Vaughn Hayden, director of the project, is calling the 10,000 mile tour through northern and central Mexico "Mission to Mexico."

They will describe their project Sunday at 7 p.m. at the Church of the Open Bible, 3195 Hilyard St., Eugene, at a program including Mexican songs and slides.

Also on the program will be a talk by the Rev. Hayden, who will tell of the missionary challenge in Mexico.

In an interview this week, the Rev. Hayden said that the project was begun after he visited Mexico as a tourist during Christmas vacation.

As he crossed the border into the United States, he said, "The Lord spoke to me to go back to Mexico"—this time as an evangelist.

When he returned to the school, he organized the student group, which includes students from several denominations.

Members of the group are Don Balema of North Bend, the only member of the group not a BSC student; Jo Ann Shouse of Tacoma, Wash., an independent; Paul Townsend of Lewiston, Idaho, Open Bible Standard Church; Frank Deister of

Roseburg, Open Bible Standard Church; Janice Simons of Hardin, Mont., Open Bible Church; Joy Onsted of Portland, Assembly of God; Key Stanton of Albany, Foursquare Gospel, and Hayden, who also lists himself as an independent.

The group has become associated with two helping agencies—the T. L. Osborn Evangelistic Assn. and Airmail from God, a group that distributes evangelical literature from airplanes.

For the trip, the students will travel in small busses, and in the eight locations for their work, will plan a weekly program featuring child evangelism in the mornings and evangelistic meeting with prayer for the sick in the evenings.

They will work through interpreters, Hayden said.

The director estimates that the trip will cost some \$3,000, and some \$1,000 of this has already been raised through donations and speaking programs.

Churches now backing the program, the Rev. Hayden said, include Foursquare Gospel Churches, Assemblies of God, Open Bible Standard Churches, Pentecostal Holiness Churches, Church of God of Cleveland, Tenn., Pentecostal Church of God, Independent Pentecostal Churches, the California Evangelical Assn. and the All-Saints Episcopal Church of Tacoma, Wash.

College Choir Sets Concert Here Sunday

A 36-voice touring choir from Warner Pacific College of Portland will be in Eugene Sunday for a 7:30 p.m. concert at the Friendly Street Church of God, 23rd Avenue and Friendly Street, Eugene.

The concert—open to the public without admission charge—will include sacred and patriotic numbers.

Director of the choir is Lauren B. Sykes, choral director at the college since 1946. Sykes has been organist-choirmaster at several metropolitan Portland churches, holds the associateship and choirmaster degrees in the American Guild of Organists, and was for several seasons organist and soloist with the Portland Symphony.

Sacred music on Sunday's program will include "Let All the Nations Praise the Lord," Leisring; "Jesus Said to the Blind Man," Vulpius; "Hallelujah, Amen," Handel; "Jesus, Friend of Sinners," Grieg; "Judge Me, O God," Mendelssohn; "God's Son Has Made Me Free," Grieg; "Love Divine," Prichard; "Church's Jubilee," Naylor; "He That Dwelleth in the Secret Place," Mueller, and "In the Beginning Was the Word," Moffatt. Patriotic selections will include the "Battle Hymn of the Republic" and "I am an American."

A feature of this season's program is a dramatic production, "The Second Journey," written and produced by Mel White. White, a former member of the choir, is now student body president at the college.

No admission will be charged for the concert, but a free-will offering will be taken.

Six-Faith Temple Planned in Capital

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—From Burma and Ceylon the money comes. From Hong Kong, France, Israel, India and Texas. It comes in dimes, quarters and thousand-dollar checks; in rupees, lire and francs.

With the money come prayers, and these are what Mrs. Juliet Hollister really wants right now.

The prayers and money will build, Mrs. Hollister hopes, a building in Washington, D.C., that will stand as a symbol of the brotherhood of man.

There, the world's six major religious forces will meet in a sort of spiritual United Nations. It will be called the Temple of Understanding.

Mrs. Hollister, a Greenwich, Conn., housewife and artist, is the driving force behind the project. She discussed it during a San Francisco stopover on a U.S. tour to drum up support.

Her concept, born of a life-long study of the world's religions, is manifest in a tentative model of the Temple designed by architect Lathrop Douglass.

Students Attend Conference

"Modern Rivals" is the theme of the regional Disciples Student Fellowship conference at Menucha conference grounds on the Columbia River.

The conference, which opened Friday and will conclude Sunday, will have a vote on the proposed merger with Presbyterian and Congregational student groups into the United Campus Christian Fellowship on the agenda.

Some 22 students from the Eugene area are attending the conference. Emerald Empire area nominees for regional offices are Sharon Hildebrand and Don David. A number of Eugeneans have been on the planning committee for the program.

"We want people to become more aware of the rich and varied spiritual life of their fellow men," Mrs. Hollister said. "And, of course, we hope this awareness will contribute to a more stable and peaceful world."

So far, she said, the project has received \$30,000 in unsolicited funds. The fund drive—for \$5 million—does not start until October.

"It's just magnificent," Mrs. Hollister said. "It shows that people do want to understand one another, and want to do something about the state of the world."

Mrs. Hollister has been working on the project for a little more than a year. She has been around the world by airplane, elephant and camel, talking to statesmen and religious leaders.

William J. Richardson, a professor at Northwest Christian College in Eugene, has been appointed to lead a study group for the 1965 World Convention of Churches of Christ, which will meet in Puerto Rico.

The appointment was announced by Jesse M. Bader of New York City, general secretary of the convention. Richardson will direct the study group in preparing a document dealing with the lay ministry of the church as it is understood and practiced by the Churches of Christ (Disciples of Christ) throughout the world.
