

On Depew's Three-Run Homer

Frosh Outlast North, 18-15

A three-run homer in the eighth inning by Rich Depew gave the Oregon Frosh an 18-15 extra inning baseball victory over host North Eugene Thursday.

Depew, who finished with eight RBIs and five of the 18

Frosh hits, hit his inside the park smash with two out. North Eugene, down 7-0 at one time, surged ahead 11-7 in the fifth inning when sophomore pitcher Mike Snow hit a bases-loaded home run over the right field fence.

But a five-run Frosh rally in the seventh wiped out a 15-10 North Eugene lead. Depew, from Klamath Falls, brought home two of them with a double. North Eugene tossed in 11 errors to aid the 18-hit Frosh attack. At the same time, Frosh

pitchers were dishing out 15 walks to go with seven Highlander hits.

Ball Would Travel Too Fast

Space Needle Stunt Called Off

SEATTLE (AP) — Officials of the Seattle World's Fair have decided they aren't going to let homer-slugger Sal Durante of Brooklyn get banged up if they can help it.

They've called off the stunt where Sal would catch a baseball dropped off the 600-foot Space Needle.

Sal was the one who grabbed

Roger Maris, record-breaking 61st homer last season.

Soon after that, officials of the big exposition offered Durante \$1,000 if he could catch a ball dropped from the Space Needle. He made plans to come to the fair and try it.

Dr. Kenneth C. Clark, a physicist at the University of Washington, came out of a one-man huddle estimating the baseball dropped from the tower would be traveling 130 miles an hour gathering speed when sure-handed Sal caught it. He made a couple of comparisons:

Maris drove that historic homer 360 feet. Figuring Durante was 20 feet above the ground where he sat in the stands, and figuring Maris lofted the ball 30 degrees—"Pretty hot and flat," said Clark—it would arrive in Durante's bare hands at a speed of 79 miles an hour. A baseball dropped from 210 feet would reach that speed.

Figuring Maris lofted the ball 45 degrees, "it would reach the fellow in the bleachers at 72 miles an hour, as if it were dropped from 171 feet."

So, doing a little subtracting, the ball dropped from the Space Needle would be doing roughly half a hundred miles an hour more than the pill Maris pounded.

"I think," said Clark, "a set of teeth is worth much more than \$1,000."

DeAutremont To Become Hoop Coach

NEW YORK (AP)—Dallas, Houston and Los Angeles still are among the bidders for the Floyd Patterson-Sonny Liston heavyweight title fight, it was learned Thursday. The site and date are to be announced Monday.

Patterson, the defending champion, has the right to pick the site. Cus D'Amato, the champ's adviser in New York and manager in many states, has been in contact with groups from many cities. So have representatives of Championship Sports, Inc., the promoters.

It was learned that the Cotton Bowl in Dallas might be available if the Dallas group succeeded in wresting the fight away from New York which appeared to be in the lead. If the fight is held in Los Angeles it would be fought in the Coliseum. Presumably the new Houston ball park would be the site in Houston. A guaranteed gate of \$1 million must be assured.
