The estimated volume is 2,350 M board feet Douglas fir, 100 M board feet of Western hemlock and 100 M board feet of Western redcedar and other coniferous species of timber. The minimum acceptable bid per M board feet is as follows: Douglas fir, \$2.50; Western hemlock, \$1.00; and Western redcedar and other coniferous species \$1.00. This includes the following rates: 50% for stumpage, 50% for stumpage, including disposal for sale area betterment, \$18.00 per acre plus an additional \$4.25 for Douglas fir, \$5.25 base rate plus an additional \$3.90 for Western hemlock, \$9.95 for Western redcedar and other coniferous species and 50% for stumpage disposal for all species. Such adjustments in the price for stumpage shall be applied on a quarterly basis following the three-month period following the quarter for which the adjustment is computed. In no event, however, shall the stumpage rates for each quarter be more than the base rates as stated above. When the adjusted rates are higher than the base rates, the difference between the total dollar value of the timber cut at adjusted rates and the total dollar value of the timber cut at base rates shall be recorded for each species.
