

Crash Leads To 40-Minute Power Outage

Two Persons Hurt In 2-Car Collision

Two persons were injured Thursday night in a two-car collision which led to a 40-minute power outage for a half-mile along Coburg Road when one of the cars smashed into a power pole.

The mishap caused a flicker in lights over a large area, said a spokesman for Eugene Water & Electric Board, but there was an outage between 10:19 and 11:04 p.m. in a limited area along Coburg Road north of Willakenzie Road.

Injured in the crash were the two drivers, Ricahd Gale Perrin, 30, of 3850 County Farm Rd., and Henry Earl Clark, 28, of Rt. 2, Box 4125, Junction City. Perrin was in fairly good condition with a possible head injury at Sacred Heart Hospital, while Clark was in good condition with lacerations.

The collision occurred on Coburg Road at the Kinney Loop intersection. State police said Clark, driving south, apparently lost control of his car on a curve and it hit the gravel shoulder, then crossed the highway and collided with Perrin's northbound car. Clark's auto continued on and struck the power pole, police said.

One Side Of 'Fireside' Catches Fire

There was a fire in the "Fireside Room" at the University of Oregon Friday.

A student in the Old Music Building, near E. 18th Avenue and Kincaid Street, spotted flames racing through draperies near a window in the second-floor room at 11:17 a.m. and turned in the alarm.

Music professor Robert G. Cunningham and several students in a music class in a nearby room grabbed an emergency fire hose and put out the blaze before Eugene firemen arrived.

The blaze damaged the window, wall and ceiling. Firemen estimated damage at \$300.

Firemen said the blaze was either of incendiary origin or caused by a careless smoker—perhaps one who tried to flip a cigarette butt out the open window.

The "Fireside Room" is so named because it has a fireplace—but there was no fire in it at the time.

Eugenean Arraigned On Check Charge

Official Notes Mill's Efforts

PORTLAND (UPI)—Harold F. Wendel, chairman of the State Sanitary Authority, said Friday he felt that the effluent problem at the Georgia-Pacific paper mill at Toledo was on its way to being solved.

Wendel and other members of the authority toured the mill's odor reduction facilities Thursday. The group also visited nearby Newport, which has complained about the problem.

"I hope we're nearing the end of a long, hard road," he said. Wendel added that "from assurances we've heard... I believe we can feel optimistic."

Earlier this year the authority said it would take action to shut down the company's Toledo mill if the effluent piped into the ocean off Newport continued to cause an odor.

Wendel said the odor appears to have been cut down but added that "if there is no relief from the problem by June 1 the problem will be referred to the attorney general's office."

Tavern Ordered Closed 7 Days

Robinson's Tavern at 550 E. 13th Ave., Eugene, has been ordered closed down for seven days starting April 30 by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission.

The action was taken on the basis of a complaint that the establishment allegedly sold beer to a minor, according to the Associated Press.

State Liquor Control Administrator D. E. Barnick said the tavern's permittee, Warren Lee Spady, also will be suspended for 15 days starting April 30 as a result of the complaint.

Guilty Plea Entered On Check Charge

A guilty plea was entered in Lane County Circuit Court Friday by Paul Powell, 46, of 1590 W. 11th Ave., Eugene. He is charged with forging a \$20 check on Feb. 28.

Powell will be sentenced Monday. He admitted passing the forged check at Alexander's Department Store in Springfield.

Straub Says He'll Attend Farm Meeting

Robert W. Straub, Eugene, candidate for the Democratic nomination to Congress from Oregon's Fourth District, said Friday he will attend a Farm Bureau meeting in Eugene.

Thursday, Charles O. Porter, one of Straub's three opponents, said he will not go to the meeting April 25 because the Farm Bureau has said it will not be open to the public.

"The meeting will be open to members of the press," Straub said Friday, "and they represent the public."

"I will be glad to go. I welcome the opportunity to speak to any group, especially agricultural, because it is a vital part of the economy. If any one of the economy. If any one needs effective representation in Congress, it is agriculture."

Pearson's Comment Hit By Thornton

State Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton said Thursday evening in Springfield that Walter D. Pearson, his opponent for the Democratic nomination for governor, is talking off base, using trumped-up charges, and quoting out of context.

Thornton spoke at Springfield Junior High School at a rally sponsored by McKenzieLand Democrats.

Pearson, a state senator from Portland, said recently that Thornton has contended that increased school financial needs can be met from off-shore oil revenues.

Thornton said Thursday evening that he is perfectly aware that no oil has been discovered in Oregon, so there is no revenue. But, he said, the law provides that all revenues from off-shore oil are earmarked for school needs and that if oil is found it will be used for such purposes.

Thornton was the only state-wide candidate to appear at the rally, but three of the four Democratic contenders for Congress were present—Patrick Flynn, Charles O. Porter and Robert Duncan.

About 60 persons turned out, and about 20 of these were candidates.
