

Visiting Choirs to Be Featured

Churches Plan Special Musical Offerings

Choirs, concerts, cantatas and special music presentations will be featured this week at many Eugene and Springfield area churches.

The week's musical offerings will be varied. A 20-voice male choir from Concordia High School in Portland will visit seven Emerald Empire Lutheran Churches of the Missouri Synod Sunday through Tuesday.

The concerts are scheduled tonight at 8 at Trinity Lutheran Church, Seventh and Quincy streets, Cottage Grove; Sunday at 11 a.m. at Hope Lutheran Church, 14th and B Streets, Springfield; Sunday at 7:30 p.m. at Messiah Lutheran Church, 3280 River Rd., Eugene; Sunday at 2 p.m. at St. Luke Lutheran Church, Oakridge; Monday at 8 p.m. at St. John Lutheran Church, Kruse and Sixth streets, Sutherlin, and Tuesday at 8 p.m. at Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church, 22nd and Elm streets, Reedsport.

A free-of-charge will be taken at the concerts, but no admission charge will be made. All the concerts are open to the public.

Three Methodist Churches—First Methodist and Trinity in Eugene and Ebert Memorial in Springfield—have scheduled special musical offerings for the Easter season.

First Methodist Church's 60-voice choir will present the St. Cecilia Mass by Charles Gounod, 19th century organist and composer, Sunday at 5 p.m. in the church sanctuary.

The program will be open to the public. This work combines the voices of a small vocal ensemble with the choral effects of a complete choir. Throughout the work, the arrangement of vocal trio (soprano, tenor and bari-

tone), contrasts with the larger choir. Soloists for the presentation will be Mrs. John Cockrell, Mrs. A. T. Hanson and Mrs. Claude E. Miller, sopranos; Dr. Glenn Gordon and James Kays, tenors; Dr. Virgil Samms and George Thomas, baritones, and Robert Wilson, bass. Marjorie Scobert Wilson will be organist.

Trinity Methodist Church, 440 Maxwell Rd., Eugene, will feature its choir in excerpts from "The Messiah" by Handel Sunday at 7:30 p.m. Soloists will be Mrs. Wolf vonOtterstedt, Dr. Virgil Samms, James Kays, Mrs. William Morrow and Mrs. Albert Wittenborn. Mrs. Arden Berg will be organist, and Jean Freeman is choir director.

The public is invited. The Christmas part of "The Messiah" was presented by the choir during the Christmas season.

A cantata, "The Seven Last Words of Christ," by Dubois, will be presented by the Ebert Memorial Methodist Church choir Sunday at the church's 11 a.m. service.

Choir director for the Springfield church is Elwin Myrick. The same cantata will be presented Thursday at First Christian Church in Eugene in connection with the church's Maundy Thursday communion service.

Scheduled for 7:30 p.m., the program and service are open to the public.

Soloists will be Everett Anderson, bass-baritone; Exine Anderson Bailey, soprano, and Arthur Bailey, tenor. Max Reisinger will be choral director, and Mary Whitson, organist.

The choir of Canyonville Bible Academy will present a concert at the Bethel Assembly of God Church at 21st and

K streets, Springfield, Sunday at 9:45 a.m.

In addition to numbers by the 30-voice choir of teenagers, the program will include duets, trios and instrumental selections.

A cantata, "The Cross of Christ" by Steward Landon, will be presented Sunday at the 11 a.m. worship service at Emmaus Lutheran Church, 1250 W. 18th Ave., Eugene.

The cantata is based on familiar hymns, and will be presented by the church's senior choir.

Also scheduled are two concerts by the Los Angeles Pacific College A Capella Choir.

The choir will sing tonight at 7:30 p.m. at the Eugene Youth for Christ Rally at the Church of the Open Bible, 3195 Hilyard St., Eugene, and Sunday at 10:45 a.m. at the First Free Methodist Church, 1295 W. 18th Ave., Eugene.

Both concerts are open to the public.

A varied selection of numbers is planned at both concerts by the 50-voice choir. Traditional church music, including a group of Russian choral favorites, will be featured in the first section, with the second section's tempo changing with selections of folk and gospel music.

The Pacific Co-eds, a ladies' trio, will be touring with the choir and presenting selections at the concert.

On Sunday, a group of singers under the direction of Vladimir Tolstouchov, assistant professor of Slavic languages at the University of Oregon, will present Palm Sunday songs in Russian at Sunday's 9:45 a.m. combined service at River-view Chapel, 2335 Riverview St., Eugene. The public is wel-

come.

Woman Describing Work of Churches

A first-hand description of the work of the Open Bible Standard churches in Jamaica and Trinidad is being given in the Emerald Empire this month by Mrs. W. Rollie Clark of 1021 Willamette St., Eugene.

Mrs. Clark, whose husband is executive vice president of Bible Standard College and director of the denomination's national youth work, accompanied Mrs. R. Bryant Mitchell of Des Moines, Iowa, on the trip. Mrs. Mitchell's husband is general chair of the denomination.

In Trinidad, Mrs. Clark said, the denomination has some 30 village churches (served by nationals) in addition to a "headquarters" church in the city of San Fernando. The denomination has been working in Trinidad for some eight years, and has established a training school, Open Bible Institute, in the country.

Trinidad, she said, has several denominations with mission programs.

The island's residents are

"quite a religious people," she noted, although not all are Christian. There are numbers of Hindus and Moslems, she said, and it was "quite a surprise" to find statues of the Hindu religion and Hindu banners and temples.

More missionary work is being done in Jamaica, Mrs. Clark said, with many more denominations working. Trinidad, she said, has largely been ignored by tourists, but the effect of the tourist trade in Jamaica is very evident, especially in the cities. There, she observed, "great contrasts" between new, modern buildings and more simple structures, although the rural areas in both islands were largely undeveloped, by United States standards.

"I was really busy during the trip," Mrs. Clark said. The two women had speaking engagements as often as three times a day.

In both countries, Mrs. Clark found that many of the young people were very anxious to leave the islands for study or jobs in the United States or England.

This was not the case with the majority of Christian young people, she said. They were interested and willing to remain in their native land and were sincere, she felt, in a desire to undertake Christian work with their people.

Church Sets 'Crusade'

A "victory crusade" will be held this week at First Conservative Baptist Church, 1660 Mohawk Blvd., Springfield, with the Rev. Harry McCormick Lintz as evangelist and Ray Robles as gospel soloist.

Services are scheduled at 7:30 nightly except Saturday and the public is welcome.

The Rev. Lintz was born in east Tennessee, in a mountain community, and gained his education through his own efforts. He graduated with distinction from Cedar Creek Academy in Tennessee, from Moody Bible Institute and from Carson-Newman College. After nine years in pastorates, he began his career as an evangelist, which he now has been for 30 years.

Robles, a recording artist, has studied at the Conservatory of Music in Florence, Italy and the American Operatic Lab in Hollywood.

Church Loses First Pastor

The Rev. Max Fisk, pastor of Calvary Temple Church in Springfield, has resigned to take a job with a subsidiary of the Open Bible Standard Church's Pacific Coast Division.

No successor has yet been named. The Rev. Fisk organized the Calvary church, located at 11th and K streets, in 1950, and designed the church structure.

He will become general manager of the recently organized Pacific Service Foundation. The foundation will assist in fund raising and financing for churches in Oregon, Washington, Idaho and California.

He and his wife will move to Eugene in the near future. His resignation from the Springfield church is effective April 29.
