Soviets Plan New Charter

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviet Premier Khrushchev set in motion Wednesday the machinery to write a new constitution and disclosed that he has put a new man into the hot seat of agriculture minister.

Khrushchev, in a brief speech to the Supreme Soviet, said the country's old Stalinist constitution of 1936 has been outgrown. A new constitution reflecting the ideological heritage of Lenin is needed, he said, to provide more solid "guarantees for the democratic rights and freedoms of the working people."

The Soviet Union, he said, has developed from a proletarian dictatorship into a proletarian democracy.

Disarmament Conference In Session

GENEVA (AP) — The 17 nation disarmament conference scheduled another session Wednesday but the attention of delegates was focused on the Pacific where U.S. nuclear tests were to be resumed immediately.

Most delegations felt that the Soviet Union and its satellites will walk out of the conference when the first test explosion is announced.

Deputy Foreign Minister Valerian Zorin, head of the Russian delegation, had the advantage Tuesday of controlling the chair through Romanian Deputy Foreign Minister George Macovescu.

Macovescu was one of the four Red satellite deputy foreign ministers who joined Zorin in breaking up the last disarmament conference two years ago.

Semyon K. Tsarapkin, Soviet nuclear test ban negotiator, was ready for his own role by having made sure he could get a meeting of the Anglo-American Soviet nuclear testing subcommittee called for this afternoon if the Russians want to make a demonstration against U.S. testing.

Zorin warned on Good Friday that there could be no "fruitful discussions" of a nuclear test ban treaty with the thunder of nuclear explosions still to be heard.

He said his government would not participate in any discussion that does not produce results. But he sidestepped a question whether this meant Russia would refuse to participate in any section of the disarmament conference, or would merely refuse to sit in the nuclear testing subcommittee.

Among other things, he said, there must be strict observance of Socialist legality — meaning safeguards against the secret police power once exercised by the executed Lavrenti Beria.

All-Out Communism
Khrushchev said a new constitution is demanded because "socialism has gained in our country full and complete victory" and the nation is now entering the phase of all-out communism.

From the standpoint of foreign relations, he went on, a new constitution is demanded because the Soviet Union has "emerged from capitalist encirclement" and must now consider problems of peaceful co-existence with other social systems in the world, and conduct relations with many other Communist countries.

In presenting a new 71-member Council of Ministers, or cabinet, Khrushchev left virtually unchanged the old council which resigned Tuesday under routine procedure. The new council was unanimously approved by the Supreme Soviet.

Chief Job Switch
The chief switch was the replacement of Agriculture Minister Mikhail Olshansky, who had the job only two years, by Konstantin Pysin, known to few outsiders.

Olshansky apparently was shelved because he failed to solve the Soviet Union's pressing agricultural problems.

Tass, the official Soviet news agency, said Pysin was Olshansky's first deputy from 1961 until a few days ago, when he apparently slipped into his new job without official announcement.

Actor to Marry
NEW YORK (AP) — British actor Michael Rennie and Mrs. Mary Gardner, ex-wife of film producer Otto Preminger, said Tuesday they will be married in the near future. The marriage will be the second for both. Mrs. Preminger, a former model, is an artist.

2 Moslems Die in Blast

ALGIERS (AP) — A booby-trapped car exploded with a roar on a busy square in downtown Algiers Wednesday, killing two Moslems. Estimates of the injured ran as high as 15.

A group of Moslems surrounded and severely beat a European woman on suspicion she had stepped from the car with two men shortly before the explosion. But police said the woman was a passer-by. She was rescued from the crowd and taken to a hospital with a fractured skull.

Police said four persons were wounded, including two policemen hit by flying fragments. Military sources said at least 15 wounded had been taken to the hospital.

Many passers-by had been warned away from the car. Some witnesses said that the woman and two men who got out of the car seemed to be running away. This aroused suspicions and there was a movement to take shelter.

Terrorists killed at least 20 persons and wounded 12 in Algeria Tuesday.

South Viet Nam Forces Kill 74 Communist Guerrillas

TRUONG HOA, South Viet Nam (AP) — South Vietnamese rangers, civil guards and planes supported by U. S. Marine helicopters killed 74 Communist guerrillas near here Tuesday.

Government forces pursued Viet Cong stragglers Wednesday.

The government forces took

three prisoners and seized a large stock of weapons. Three government men were lost. The operation is taking place 105 miles southwest of Saigon in an area of the Mekong River delta heavily infiltrated by Viet Cong guerrillas.

It was the second operation in which the U. S. Marine helicopter unit has participated since arriving in South Viet Nam two weeks ago.

A U. S. Army H21 troop-carrying helicopter was shot down by Communist ground fire 30 miles southwest of Saigon Tuesday but there were no casualties. It was the second U. S. helicopter downed by Communist fire. About 15 others have been hit by small arms fire.

Earthquake Jars Southern France

UPPSALA, Sweden (AP) — Uppsala University's seismograph showed indication of a disturbance shortly before 6 a.m. Wednesday, and a sharp earthquake shook the Grenoble area of southeast France about the same time.

After investigation, Severin Duda of the Uppsala Seismological Institution said the disturbance recorded by his instruments was probably an earthquake. There had been speculation earlier that it was the first blast in the new U. S. series of nuclear tests in the Pacific.

Air Pact Approved

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two Civil Aeronautics Board examiners Tuesday recommended approval of an agreement between Pan American World Airways and Braniff that would allow single plane service between Texas and Europe via Chicago.

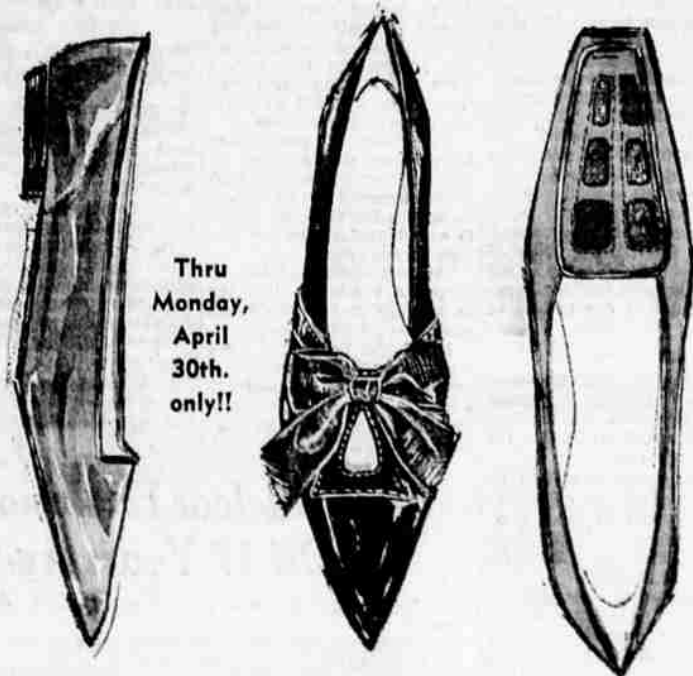
