

Briton Urges Firm Policy

NEW YORK (AP) — British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan urged the West "to be firm but patient; never to yield and never to give ground; but never to take provocative action ourselves."

He says he believes that if the free world follows this policy the Russians—in "maybe one, maybe two generations, maybe more"—will be ready for a better peace than one "preserved by mutual fear."

Dean, Zorin Disagree On Propaganda

GENEVA (AP) — U.S. Ambassador Arthur H. Dean and Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Valerian A. Zorin told the 17-nation disarmament conference Friday they could not agree on outlawing war propaganda.

Dean said the Soviet proposal for a ban on war propaganda—a side issue at the disarmament parley—would violate American constitutional freedoms of speech, of press and of assembly. The two positions were so opposed as to be impossible to bridge, he said.

Zorin said Dean's position in their talks showed the United States is unwilling to reduce world tensions or "stop the military hysteria which is under way in the United States and in other countries linked with the military blocs."

Despite his outburst of shouting Thursday against the new American nuclear tests, Zorin made no further reference to them at Friday's plenary session of the conference.

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East Pakistan Leader Dies

DACCA, East Pakistan (AP) — Abdul Kasem Fazlul Huq, 92, the architect of East Pakistan, died Friday after a long illness.

Fazlul Huq was one of the leading members of Mohammed Ali Jinnah's all-India Muslim League and was the league's president from 1916 to 1921.

He broke with Jinnah in the 1920s. But when Indian independence drew near after World War II Fazlul Huq rejoined the league and played a major part in forcing the allocation of his native East Bengal to Pakistan, 1,000 miles to the west.

East Bengal became East Pakistan and for a decade after Fazlul Huq was the leading political figure. He announced his retirement from public life in 1954, returned as governor in 1956 and finally was shelved in 1958 by President Iskander Mirza.

'Every Legal Means' Peronist Forces To Fight in Court

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP) — Peronist forces Friday called off plans for giant May Day demonstrations and announced they will fight instead by "every legal means" to protect their voting rights.

Andres Framini, tough textile union leader, said he will enter a plea in federal court for an injunction against the federal government's annulment of March 18 elections in which Peronists won sweeping successes in governorship and chamber of deputies contests. Framini was elected governor of populous Buenos Aires Province.

Elections Nullified

The Peronists would have taken office on May 1, but President Jose Maria Guido this week nullified all provincial, municipal and congressional elections that have been held since last Dec. 17.

The Peronists had warned against "grave social disorders" if the elections were voided, and the Peronist-dominated General Confederation of Labor had put its nearly three million members on alert to strike on May 1.

The federation of government workers also had voted to support the General Confederation of Labor with its one million members.

Fresh Wave Of Strikes Hits Algeria

Terrorism Blamed For Business Lag

ALGIERS (AP) — A new wave of strikes broke out in Algeria Friday as business leaders deplored the drastic drop in commerce caused by terrorism and insecurity.

The postoffices, telephone and telegraph services, banks, gasoline service stations and the University of Algiers were affected.

The strikers joined an estimated 8,000 industrial workers in the Oran area who went on a strike of indefinite length Wednesday.

The president of the Algerian Commercial Club, Adrien Chollet, said imports from France dropped 20 per cent during the first three months of 1962, and business has fallen as much as 80 per cent in some sectors.

The provisional government, in its barricaded enclosure of Rocher Noir outside Algiers, announced it would recruit its own policemen to better protect the Moslem community from European Secret Army Organization attacks. The Moslems say policemen of their own race would be more vigilant on their behalf than Europeans.

At least two Moslems were killed and seven wounded in separate terrorist attacks Friday. A European policeman was shot and wounded.

PARIS (AP) — The French National Assembly gave Premier Georges Pompidou a 259-128 vote of confidence Friday.

The vote clearly reflected criticism that deputies had expressed of President Charles de Gaulle's European unity plans and fears that the French constitution may be further changed to reduce the power of Parliament.

This was Pompidou's baptism of fire in the National Assembly. He formed his government only 10 days ago to replace the outgoing Cabinet of Michel Debre. Pompidou never has been a member of Parliament, and this was also interpreted as a rebuff for the legislature.

Only 387 of the 551 deputies cast valid ballots, and 119 abstained.

The president worked to complete a new cabinet by midnight.

The armed forces, who picked Guido as the legal successor to deposed Arturo Frondizi, remained alert. Navy warships were reported holding stand-by maneuvers. Army Secretary Gen. Juan Bautista Loza visited troops at Cordoba on a continued field inspection trip.

AF Secret 'Jungle Gym' Plan Would Blast Guerrillas Deaf

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Air Force was reported Friday to have developed a highly secret anti-guerrilla program for Communist-threatened South Vietnam under the code name of "Jungle Gym."

Few details are known, but sources said one part of the plan was to use transport planes to rain concussion bombs on the Communist-infested South Vietnamese jungle.

The aim would be to burst the eardrums of Communist guerrillas, crippling them for further combat and demoralizing those who were not injured. Some probably would be killed by fragments, but that would not be the main purpose.

A concussion bomb relies for its effect on the blast of its detonation rather than the fragmentation of its case.

The planes would be loaded with hundreds of the charges on special racks, the sources said. Roaring over areas known to be infested with the Communists, the planes would pattern-bomb the jungles in which the Red Viet Cong operates.

Care would be taken not to attack areas where South Vietnamese government forces were in the field against the Communists.

It was not known whether these missions would be flown by American pilots alone, or accompanied by South Vietnamese fliers.

Until now, the stated mission of the U.S. Air Force in South Vietnam has been to instruct native pilots in the use of American-supplied planes and other equipment. Sometimes this has carried the American pilots into combat situations.

U.S. pilots have flown troop-carrying and leaflet-dropping missions and American planes have sprayed chemicals on jungle trees in a so-far unsuccessful experiment aimed at stripping away the leaves that give the Communist guerrillas cover.
