

500 Ministers, Delegates Expected

OBS Conference to Open Here Saturday

Over 500 ministers and delegates from the five states comprising the Pacific Division of Open Bible Standard Churches will be in Eugene Monday through Thursday for a missionary conference and the division's annual conference.

Conference theme will be "Operation Breakthrough," and daily themes will be in emphasis. Most programs are planned for Lighthouse Temple, 1209 Olive St., Eugene, and the majority will be open to the public.

"Breakthrough Missions" will be the missionary conference theme Monday, and a public program is scheduled for 8 p.m., daylight, at Lighthouse Temple.

The speakers will include several missionaries originally from the Emerald Empire. The Rev. and Mrs. Wilburn Duncan, Centralia, Wash., and the Rev. and Mrs. Milton Steward, who are former Emerald Empire residents, will discuss missionary work in the Caribbean.

The Rev. and Mrs. Martin Hallberg, formerly of Everett, Wash., will discuss the missionary work they will soon begin in Liberia. Also speaking on missionary work in Liberia will be the Rev. and Mrs. Harold Crossman, on furlough from the republic and presently living in Junction City.

Missionary work in Trinidad will be described by two other Emerald Empire residents, the Rev. and Mrs. William Whitlow, now on furlough from the field.

Also on the program will be the Rev. O. R. Isbill, missionary secretary for Open Bible Standard Churches.

Tuesday's program is titled "Breakthrough—Open Bible Standard." Spiritual preparation for the program will be held at 11 a.m., daylight, by the Rev. Dennis Bennett, pastor of St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Seattle. He will also speak at a luncheon for ministers and their wives at 1:30 p.m., daylight.

A business session is scheduled for 3 p.m., daylight, Tuesday.

Opening evening rally for the regular convention program will be held at 6 p.m., daylight, Tuesday, when the Rev. Bryant Mitchell of Des Moines, Iowa, will give the featured address. He is chairman (the top executive post) of Open Bible Standard Churches.

The Rev. C. Russell Archer of Tacoma, Wash., is program chairman.

On Wednesday, the denomination's attention will turn to church extension.

The Rev. A. O. Ramseyer of Aberdeen, Wash., formerly a pastor in Toronto, Canada, will conduct a prayer and Bible study session

at 9 a.m., daylight. A business session is scheduled for 10 a.m., daylight.

Wednesday at 1:30 p.m., daylight, Mel White—television chairman for the Portland Youth for Christ—will be the featured speaker at a luncheon at First Christian Church, Eugene.

The luncheon is open to the public, and reservations may be made through First Christian's office.

White is the producer of three films, all widely distributed in this area by Youth for Christ. His luncheon address will be "Desperate to Communicate."

A second Wednesday business session scheduled for 3 p.m., daylight. The evening program for Wednesday will be titled "Breakthrough Extension," and the Rev. Max Fisk of Eugene, new director of the recently-formed Pacific Service Foundation, an organization to promote and finance new churches, will be the featured speaker. Program chairman will be Edward Wood, OBS district superintendent for northern California.

"Breakthrough Education" will be the theme for the final day's program on Thursday. The Rev. Harry Strachan of Klamath Falls will conduct the 9 a.m. daylight Bible study and prayer session, which will be followed at 10 a.m., daylight, by a business session. The

Rev. Mitchell will present an "OBS Panorama" at 11 a.m., daylight.

Two laymen's organizations of the denomination, the Women's World Fellowship, an organization that promotes missionary work, and the Men of Vision, a men's lay group that works to promote church work in the United States, will have separate luncheons at 1:30 p.m., daylight.

The WWF luncheon will be at the Colonial Inn, and the men will meet at the Bible Standard College auditorium.

Thursday afternoon, beginning at 3:30 p.m., daylight, two 50-minute workshop sessions in the fields of ministry, music in the church, Sunday school practices, church business, youth in action and the WWF organization will be held.

The final program will be an evening session Thursday at 8 p.m., daylight, featuring the Rev. Frank Smith of Des Moines, Iowa, vice chairman of the OBS churches, as speaker. The Rev. H. C. Klapstein, Eugene, divisional superintendent for the Pacific states, will be program chairman.

Preceding the opening of the convention, alumni of Bible Standard College in Eugene will have an alumni banquet Monday at 4:30 p.m., daylight, at the college. Reservations may be made through the BSC office.
