

Released-Time Classes Endeavor Needs Funds

Are the released-time Bible classes for Eugene elementary school children to continue?

This is a question before Eugene's churches. The future of the program now depends on their response to a fund appeal from the Eugene Council of Christian Education, the non-profit, interdenominational group that organizes and sponsors the program in Eugene.

Released-time Bible classes are held for Eugene elementary school pupils by request of their parents. Classes are scheduled for one hour or less each week, during school hours, in buildings near—but off—the school grounds.

At Tuesday's annual dinner meeting of the council, the four released-time teachers—who have some \$1,586 due in back salaries—were rehired for next year, and Council members approved facilities for religious services a recommendation that classes be set up for pupils from another Eugene school, Ellis Parker.

'International Peace Corps' In 16th Year

This summer, the "International Peace Corps" of the World Council of Churches will begin its 16th season. Compared to the U.S. Peace Corps, now just a year old, the World Council program is practically grown up.

Some 1,100 students—mostly of college age—from many nations of the world—will be involved in this summer's World Council program, working on projects that range from building a stable in Madagascar to digging a canal in Switzerland.

To participate in this program, the students pay their own expenses.

Organized in 1947

Unlike the U.S. Peace Corps, the World Council version—Ecumenical Work Camps—operate only one or two months out of the year. The camps were first organized in 1947 for post-war relief and rehabilitation work. Today, most projects are concerned with construction and community development.

The projects, according to the Rev. C. Frederick Stoerker, work camp director for America, are selected on the following basis: "The work must fill a legitimate need, have an ecumenical dimension and be related to the work of the cooperating churches."

Each of the 45 camps, he said, will have some 25 persons, including two co-leaders with previous work camp experience.

Not for Tourists

Participation in the camps, the Reverend Stoerker said, will not be a tourist program. With a full schedule of work, study and discussion, he said, the participants will be "lucky if they can find any free time at all."

And the value of the program to the individual?

"Some Christians," the Reverend Stoerker said, "tend to live in little airtight compartments—mostly upper middle-class—which the work camp helps to ventilate. The program brings our students into close contact with other young people from drastically different social, cultural and religious backgrounds. It is amazing, year after year, to watch quickening concerns and interests which would probably not develop in any other atmosphere."

This year's projects will include the construction of a 1,000-foot canal for flood prevention in a small Swiss mountain valley, an apartment cleaning project for aged and handicapped persons in St. Louis, Mo., work on a community service center in Mataguay, Puerto Rico, renovation of a church and barracks and clearing of a camping area and open air theater in Aah, Sweden, construction of a chapel in Iceland, construction of a bus station in The Netherlands, building of a youth center in Northern Rhodesia and renovation of a leprosy hospital in Taiwan (Formosa).

Fees for participation—which do not include travel expenses to and from the project—range from \$55 for projects in Africa, Asia and Latin America to \$70 in Europe.

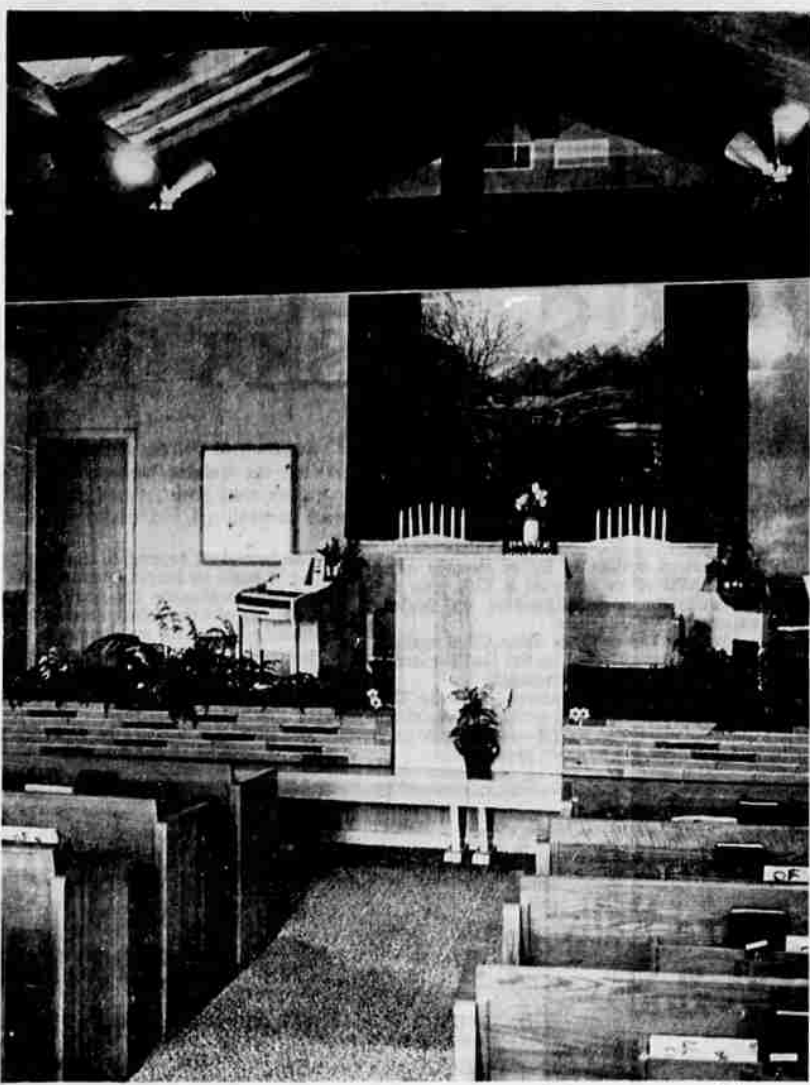

Sister City Idea Goes To Church

Eugene has a sister city, Chinju, Korea, and now one of the churches in the Eugene-Springfield area has "adopted" a sister church.

Members of the Wayside Open Bible Chapel, 53rd and B Streets, Springfield, agreed last Sunday to adopt a church in Trinidad, one of the denomination's main missionary countries.

And although the Springfield church has only some 50 adults attending an average Sunday worship service, the congregation raised \$500 Sunday for the program.

The Rev. Ray Rexius of Eugene, pastor of the church, said that the money would probably be used to buy a Trinidad church a building site. The \$500, he said, would probably cover this cost—then the Springfield church can go ahead and aid its sister church with funds for building.

Congregations in Trinidad, the minister added, are poor—a congregation will sometimes number as many as 100 or 200 members before a regular building can be acquired.

Meetings, he said, are held in the open or in homes, due to the lack of buildings.

The congregation undertook the project, the minister said, as "we felt that this was what we wanted to do."

Wayside Open Bible To Hold Ceremonies

Dedication ceremonies for the new Wayside Open Bible Chapel building at 53rd and B Streets, Springfield, will be held Sunday at 3:30 p.m. standard, 4:30 p.m., daylight.

First services in the building—which will seat some 150 persons in the main room—were held Easter Sunday. Most of the construction of the building, which with another unit and the land is valued at \$30,000, was done by volunteer labor over a period of more than a year.

Featured speaker for the dedication program will be the Rev. R. Bryant Mitchell of Des Moines, Iowa, national chairman of Open Bible Standard Churches. He has been in Eugene for the denomination's Pacific division convention.

Also on the program will be the Rev. Harvey Klapstein of Eugene, Pacific division superintendent; the Rev. Herb Bradshaw, Oregon division superintendent and pastor of

Children's Home Dedication Sunday

The new chapel at the Children's Farm Home near Corvallis will be dedicated Sunday, in ceremonies at the home at 2 p.m. standard, 3 p.m. daylight. The home is located between Corvallis and Albany on Hwy. 20.

Presiding at the ceremonies will be H. V. Johnson of Eugene, who is president of the Home's board of trustees. Marshall N. Dana, former editor of the Oregon Journal will give the dedicatory address, and Mrs. William I. Hargis of Portland, president of the Oregon Woman's Christian Temperance Union, will present a history of the home, which was begun by the WCTU and still receives a large portion of its support from the organization.

This new chapel will replace one which burned down last year, leaving the home without and large-scale meetings.

Much of the labor and materials for the new building were donated by individuals and firms throughout the state. Furnishings, however, are still needed.
